2019 LENTEN REGULATIONS

Lent this year begins on **March 6, Ash Wednesday**. Lent is a season in which the faithful are called to reflect on the Paschal Mystery in a particularly focused way. It is a time of spiritual renewal and to carefully examine one's relationship with God and others. It is also a time in which catechumens prepare to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. The Church calls everyone, therefore, to a spirit of penance through the traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

-All persons, 14 years and older, are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Other forms of abstinence, including abstinence from alcoholic beverages, television, video games, the internet and social media during and other electronic devices Lent is spiritually beneficial.

-Everyone from ages 18 to 59 is obliged to **fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent, especially on Wednesdays and Fridays, is highly recommended. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, neither the law of fasting nor the law of abstinence obliges. If in doubt, one's parish priest or confessor should be consulted.

PRAYER

-Catholics are urged to read and pray with sacred Scripture more intently during Lent. The faithful are encouraged to participate in special devotions offered by the parish, especially parish penance services and Eucharistic adoration. Other devotions such as the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, visits to the Blessed Sacrament, and praying for vocations to the priesthood and religious life are also encouraged.

-The Stations of the Cross are to be celebrated in each parish on Fridays during Lent and everyone is encouraged to attend.

ALMSGIVING

-All Catholics are urged to give generously to assist the poor and support the charitable works of the Church, especially through their local parish and the Annual Catholic Appeal.

-The faithful are also encouraged to visit the sick, the homebound, the aged, and those in prison, remembering the words of our Lord Jesus Christ who said, "As you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me." (Matthew 25:40). Fasting and abstinence together with almsgiving and charitable works unites us to the crucified Christ reflected in the image of our brothers and sisters who suffer.

Liturgical Tidbit **The Symbol of Ashes**

Have you ever wondered what the ashes that we receive on Ash Wednesday means? A big clue to what it means lie within what the priest or minister says as they place the ashes on your forehead. The Church has two suggestions for a formula to say during that time. The first is "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." We will see in some examples of the different Old Testament figures, as a sign of public repentance and coming back to God, the ancient Israelites would wear a sackcloth and ashes were put around their bodies. Now, as Christians, being saved through the cross of Christ and as believers of the Gospel, we continue this practice by having a cross of ash drawn on our foreheads as a public sign of repentance. The second formula is "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Remember that in the Book of Genesis, the human being is formed from the dust of the earth? The word *humility* comes from Latin word "*humus*," meaning *earth*. So at the beginning of Lent, our Lord calls us back to the earth as to *humble* ourselves as we come into a season of repentance.

Financial Literacy Course **March 24-June 9**

When we have our "financial house" in order it allows us to be in greater peace, and provides a means to share more with others. St. James will offer a 9-week financial literacy course entitled *Financial Peace University*, to be held on Sundays from 1-3 in the St. Ignatius Room. Topics include money and how it affects your relationships; budgeting and setting up a plan for your money; getting out of debt, planning and saving for the future as well as making responsible money decisions. Cost per family is \$130.00 for the workbook materials and access to online presentations. Partial scholarships are available, by speaking to Fr. Rey. 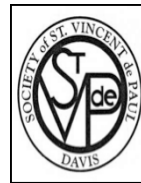

The Vincentian Corner

March 10, 2019-First Sunday of Lent:

Lent is a call not just to "give up something" but—more important—to "give something for the poor." In our parish are many poor families.



When those in need call or come to the parish office for help, they are in fact reaching out to each parishioner.

The holiness of St. Vincent and of each one of us in the last analysis is a gift of God. The holiness of a saint is a sharing in the holiness of God Himself, and we recognize holiness when we see the fruits of the Holy Spirit in the life of a person. The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, kindness, patience, goodness, faithfulness, and gentleness. This Lent, please keep in mind that when we give to the poor, God pours his love, peace, and joy into our hearts and into our lives. Do you have a saint whose life you try to emulate? Consider how this saint might observe Lent. Would "your" saint simply choose to give up a laundry list of personal pleasures or would he or she respond the needs of the less fortunate? Think how you can make your Lent a time to look out from your own needs and see the needs of others.

Environmental Justice

Pope Francis calls us in *Laudato Si* to take action on behalf of creation. One way we can do that is by learning how we can respond to the difficult issues surrounding climate change, and Lent is a perfect time for such reflection and study. A wonderful opportunity is the Yolo Interfaith Alliance for Climate Justice (St. James is a member) conference on Saturday March 16 at the Methodist Church, 1620 Anderson, from 1:00-4:00. Sharon Delgado will be one of the keynote speakers. She is the author of "Love in a Time of Climate Change," which our Environmental Justice group is studying and discussing at our monthly meetings, the second Monday of the month at 6:30 in the St. Ignatius Room. Michael McCormick, a former staffer of Governor Brown, will be the other keynote, and will speak about climate change and land use. Please join us and be both inspired and informed!

Precauciones para evitar el contagio.

El Departamento de Salud Publica de California ha reportado que la incidencia del Flu y enfermedades similares ha llegado a un extremo en que se deben aplicar medidas para evitar contagios durante la Misa.

- No darse la mano. Ofrecer el signo de paz con una inclinación de la cabeza diciendo "la paz este contigo."
- No tomarse de la mano durante el Padrenuestro.
- Los ministros de la Eucaristía deben limpiarse las manos con un antiséptico a base de alcohol antes y después de administrar la Sagrada Comunión a los que visitan en sus casas.

La asistencia a Misa los domingos y días festivos no es obligatoria para los enfermos. Si estás enfermo, quédate en casa y cuídate.

Gracia por su paciencia y comprensión durante esta temporada. Rueda por los enfermos. La Sagrada Comunión por los dos medios retornará cuando el Señor Obispo lo juzgue prudente.

Reglamentos Cuaresmales del 2019

El 6 de marzo de 2019, Miércoles de Ceniza, emprendemos otra vez el recorrido cuaresmal durante el cual procuramos profundizar nuestra conversión. La cuaresma nos prepara para celebrar el Misterio Pascual de la pasión, muerte y resurrección de Cristo. AYUNO Y ABSTINENCIA

Abstinencia: Todas las personas que hayan cumplido los 14 años de edad tienen la obligación de **abstenerse de comer carne el miércoles de Ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma**. Otras formas de abstinencia durante la Cuaresma serían: abstenerse de bebidas alcohólicas, televisión, videojuegos, internet, redes sociales y otros dispositivos electrónicos. La Cuaresma es espiritualmente beneficiosa.

Ayuno: Todas las personas, de 18 años hasta los 59, tienen la obligación de **ayunar el miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo**. El ayuno es opcional en otros días de la cuaresma, especialmente los miércoles y viernes, es sumamente recomendable. En casos en que peligre la salud o la capacidad de trabajo, no se aplican las leyes del ayuno y abstinencia. Si se tienen dudas al respecto, se ha de consultar con un sacerdote de la parroquia o con un confesor.

ORACIÓN

Con el fin de profundizar nuestro amor por Cristo, los católicos debemos orar y meditar las Sagradas Escrituras; participar en los actos piadosos que ofrezca nuestra parroquia; y orar con mayor fervor individualmente, en familia y en comunión con otras personas. A los fieles se les exhorta a que recen el rosario, visiten al Santísimo Sacramento y oren, especialmente por las vocaciones al sacerdocio y a la vida consagrada, y por la paz mundial.

LIMOSNA

Todos los católicos se les pide que ayuden generosamente a las obras caritativas de la Iglesia, incluyendo las contribuciones regulares a su parroquia y a la Campaña Católica Anual. Se les invita también a que ayuden de diferentes maneras a los enfermos, a los necesitados, a los ancianos y encarcelados. El ayuno y la abstinencia junto con las obras de caridad ayudan al católico a vivir en solidaridad con Cristo crucificado reflejado en la imagen de sus hermanos y hermanas que sufren.
