LITURGICAL TIDBIT

"And with your Spirit!?"

In the past decade, I'm sure we all remember when the translation for some parts of the Mass was changed. One of the changes that we may still be getting used to is instead of saying "and also with you" we now respond with "and with your Spirit" when clergy invokes the Lord to be with us. Why was the change necessary? To put it simply, it is because the old English translation was not an accurate translation. The original Latin response was "*Et cum spiritu tuo.*" We say "and with your spirit" to the clergy saying "The Lord be with You," because during the liturgy he is acting in the spirit of his ordination; Jesus Christ. As a people, we are addressing the spirit in whom the clergy is acting on behalf of. We are also asking God's spirit, more specifically, for help for the clergy to use the charismatic gifts given to him in ordination and in so doing to fulfill his prophetic function in the Church. The clergy does the same to us when he says "The Lord be with you!" and so we return the greeting. May the Lord continue to guide our clergy to be faithful leaders in the Church!

As we celebrate the mystery of the Trinity, we also realize the mystery of how much God loves and cares for us each day. Believing in this our lives can then overflow in thanksgiving and praise.



At each SVdeP meeting, Vincentians pray, "Make us responsive to the Christian calling to seek and find the forgotten, the suffering, or the deprived so that we may bring them Your love." As the income gap between the comfortable and those on the edge becomes wider, the role of the St. Vincent de Paul Society in our community becomes more vital. For the needy, housing has reached a crisis as has the cost of purchasing groceries. On average, each month, our SVdeP hotline receives at least one call for assistance per day. Of these, our volunteers have made home visits to and/or had extensive telephone contact with the majority while providing referrals to those whose needs we cannot meet or who reside in other location. During the 2018 calendar year, the St. James Conference provided \$47,852 in direct emergency financial assistance as well as \$5,820 in in-kind goods. Thanks to all those parishioners who have contributed to help us keep up with the growing need.

If these added times and days are well attended, the Liturgy Committee and Clergy will consider adding more than the First Thursday/Friday and possibly more days for evening daily masses.

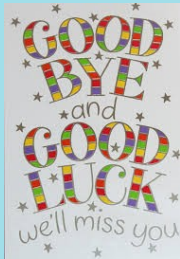

AND, YOU, WHO DO YOU SAY I AM?

Do we hear Jesus asking this question as we sit before Him in Adoration? Are we listening to Him? Do we come to listen? Are we willing to lay down our lives if He asks us? Besides the importance of listening to Him, our communication with Him can be ever more complete, too, if we lay our fears, problems, sorrows and sins before Him, as well as list all the blessings for which we are thankful. If we come to him in despair, we can look for hope. If we feel surrounded by darkness, we can seek His light. If we truly sit in trust and love before him we can look for intimacy with Him.

You come to Adoration, the sacred place of God's presence, to meet Jesus and speak to him face to face, heart to heart. With your whole mind, body and soul you seek His affection, remembering that He became flesh for you so that you would encounter him in the flesh and receive his love in the flesh. Jesus came to create in you a space where you can be with him, for He wants you to live the freedom of the children of God. Also remember Jesus' words for us: "Do not be afraid." Make it a habit to spend time each week in Adoration. Through this intimate experience with our Lord you will bear witness to the Word of life in all that you do. Come in silence and trust; for He is expecting you. Eventually you will be able to answer His question. Try!!

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En 1910, cuatro años antes de iniciar el día de las madres, el pueblo de los Estados Unidos empezó a celebrar ocasionalmente un día para los padres de familia. Pero, no fue hasta 1972 que se fijó un día oficial para el papá. Poco a poco esta fecha del segundo domingo de junio se ha ido expandiendo al resto del mundo con algunas excepciones. En Italia por ejemplo, la fiesta del padre se celebra el 19 de marzo, día de san José.

Durante la Revolución Industrial del siglo diecinueve, José, esposo de María recibió su primera fiesta oficial. La Iglesia, preocupada por el ingreso del padre a las fábricas, propuso a este santo varón como ejemplo de lo que los padres deben ser en la vida de sus hijos e hijas; ejemplos de fe, ternura y trabajo. Aún en nuestro tiempo, el Rito del Bautismo de Niños insiste que el padre, junto con la madre, deben ser los mayores maestros de sus hijos. Al igual que José, el papá debe cuidar y proteger a su familia, enseñarle a los niños a trabajar y ser honestos para el bien de la familia y la sociedad.

ESTA ES LA SANTÍSIMA TRINIDAD

Hoy celebramos a la Santísima Trinidad, uno de los misterios más confusos de nuestra fe. Por medio de este misterio, experimentamos nuestra relación con Dios: Creador, Salvador y Santificador. Esta relación no es fácil de entender o describir. No se hace más clara por el análisis. Su complejidad refleja la complejidad de todas nuestras relaciones. Entendemos nuestras relaciones con nuestra esposa, nuestros hijos, nuestros padres y nuestros amigos solamente en el día a día, ritos anuales y esos momentos que cambian la vida que compartimos. Entendemos nuestras relaciones al vivir con ellas. Las relaciones que tenemos con los que amamos y con quienes nos aman, nos sustentan por medio de una vida incierta y difícil. Esta es la Santísima Trinidad.

Lo que es sorprendente de las lecturas de hoy es que cada una está incompleta. Lo que ellas ofrecen es una descripción de un momento de nuestra relación, una memoria de un tiempo y un evento donde nuestra relación tiene sentido, aunque ese sentido pueda estar más allá de nuestra habilidad para describirla completamente. Frecuentemente eso es todo lo ofrece nuestra fe, es decir, una memoria de lo que es posible, lo que se promete lo que se ha dado. Una memoria de eternidad, de amor, más allá del entendimiento, debe ser apreciada y nutrida incluso si no es completamente comprendida. Esta es la Santísima Trinidad.
