St. James School-Parish Connection February 13-14, 2021

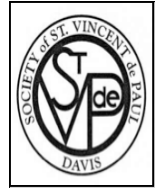

The late Ken Untener, Bishop of Saginaw, Michigan and originator of the "little books" that many of us use during Advent, Lent, and the Easter Season, once characterized a "great parish" as one, which among other things, "went out to people who were in need – in need of someone to talk to or in need of money or in need of food – and helped them." Bishop Untener also said, "Jesus wasn't telling us to become poor. He was warning us about how we who are not poor can construct a life that cuts us off from the poor. We can insulate ourselves from two-thirds of the world." As Catholics prepare for Ash Wednesday this week, Lent seems to have taken on a new and demanding shape as we are faced the continuing public health problems stemming from the COVID pandemic as well as the resulting economic downturn. Service to the poor and suffering is central to the Vincentian calling. If are considering help for the needy as part of your Lenten sacrifice this year, perhaps you might find the Society of St. Vincent de Paul a good entry point. --I have long had a curiosity about "Mission Statements" – who composes them, what they say, what people think when they read them—all of which makes me wonder—"what is the mission statement" that should be at the center of our lives? Hopefully for each of us it will say "love one another, the oppressed, the forgotten, the poor, the neglected, the lonely, etc...."

God's love is inclusive and unconditional – unconditional love says 'I love you even if I don't agree with you.' Regardless of our differences, we are all children of God, people on a journey, and, not a finished product. Heaven will consist of all of us despite our differences—Black, white, liberal, conservative, protestant, catholic, gay, straight, etc. The mercy of God is wide – we should not make it narrow. In becoming human, God gave dignity to human life. Our life should be our sermon, our mission statement. God asks us to show the same love to others that He shows us. What is important is what is in our heart. Love heals; love brings down barriers. We pray: "Dear God, let us see all people through the eyes of your love for us."

--People matter most to God. In respecting others we honor God and proclaim the Gospel message. We are each anointed by God to do good, to proclaim the Gospel to the world by our lives. God works through the expression of love. We love in faith. We express our love for God by loving others—especially those who are difficult to love, those who need our prayers and those who are unkind to us. One day, God will ask each of us "did we express our faith in love?" "did we promote love and healing in our world?" It has been said: "our soul is nourished when we are kind."

--The closest thing to the heart of God is helping hurting people.

--Going to church is great but our real work begins when we leave church services and bring the good news and love of God into our world.

--There is enough food to feed the needy; there is not enough food to feed the greedy.

--It is not how much you have that matters – it is what you are doing with what you have.

--Every person's life matters in God's eyes – may this be our prayer of thanksgiving today. May each of our lives radiate the beauty of life and God's love for all of us.

Go to the website and click on the "Bringing Home the Word" link. Select the week you want to read, and enjoy!

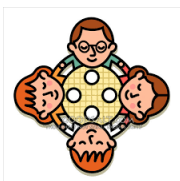
SMALL GROUP FAITH SHARING

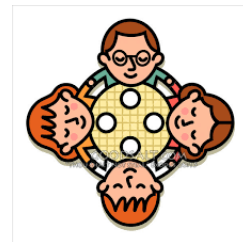

Por la misma razón, confesamos nuestras culpas de pie, para que Dios nos reivindique en el perdón; cantamos el himno del Gloria, proclamamos el Credo, presentamos nuestras ofrendas, oramos el Padrenuestro, comulgamos y recibimos la bendición. Somos el pueblo de Dios.
