LITURGICAL TIDBIT

"And with your Spirit!?"

In the past decade, I'm sure we all remember when the translation for some parts of the Mass was changed. One of the changes that we may still be getting used to is instead of saying "and also with you" we now respond with "and with your Spirit" when clergy invokes the Lord to be with us. Why was the change necessary? To put it simply, it is because the old English translation was not an accurate translation. The original Latin response was "*Et cum spiritu tuo.*" We say "and with your spirit" to the clergy saying "The Lord be with You," because during the liturgy he is acting in the spirit of his ordination; Jesus Christ. As a people, we are addressing the spirit in whom the clergy is acting on behalf of. We are also asking God's spirit, more specifically, for help for the clergy to use the charismatic gifts given to him in ordination and in so doing to fulfill his prophetic function in the Church. The clergy does the same to us when he says "The Lord be with you!" and so we return the greeting. May the Lord continue to guide our clergy to be faithful leaders in the Church!

What is Pentecost Sunday?

The Christian holy day of **Pentecost**, which is celebrated on the eighth Sunday after Easter, commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2:1-31). In Christian tradition, this event represents the birth of the early Church.

In Eastern Christianity, Pentecost can also refer to the entire fifty days of Easter through Pentecost inclusive; hence the book containing the liturgical texts is called the "*Pentecostarion*". Since its date depends on the date of Easter, Pentecost is a moveable feast.

June 9—Pentecost Sunday

Today as we celebrate Pentecost, the Holy Spirit wants to make us advocates of God's presence to bring new life to others, especially those who do not know the love of God in their lives.



We must monitor the way we live so that others truly see us as advocates of God's presence. The two Corporal Works of Mercy that most fully resonate with Vincentians are "Shelter the Homeless" and "Feed the Hungry." Of homelessness, Pope Francis says, "How can it be that it is not a news item when an elderly homeless person dies of exposure, but it is news when the stock market loses two points?" The Holy Father also remarks, "Consumerism has accustomed us to waste, but throwing food away is like stealing it from the poor and hungry." Approximately 40 million Americans, nearly one out of every eight of our fellow citizens, live in poverty. Of these, 12.8 million are children. When our home visitors pay calls on those in need, we often find two or three children in the household. How can this be allowed in the wealthiest nation in the world? What can you do to stand beside those in need?

AND, YOU, WHO DO YOU SAY I AM?

Do we hear Jesus asking this question as we sit before Him in Adoration? Are we listening to Him? Do we come to listen? Are we willing to lay down our lives if He asks us? Besides the importance of listening to Him, our communication with Him can be ever more complete, too, if we lay our fears, problems, sorrows and sins before Him, as well as list all the blessings for which we are thankful. If we come to him in despair, we can look for hope. If we feel surrounded by darkness, we can seek His light. If we truly sit in trust and love before him we can look for intimacy with Him.

You come to Adoration, the sacred place of God's presence, to meet Jesus and speak to him face to face, heart to heart. With your whole mind, body and soul you seek His affection, remembering that He became flesh for you so that you would encounter him in the flesh and receive his love in the flesh. Jesus came to create in you a space where you can be with him, for He wants you to live the freedom of the children of God. Also remember Jesus' words for us: "Do not be afraid."

Make it a habit to spend time each week in Adoration. Through this intimate experience with our Lord you will bear witness to the Word of life in all that you do. Come in silence and trust; for He is expecting you. Eventually you will be able to answer His question. Try!!

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Hoy celebramos la Pascua de Pentecostés. Esta es una de las tres Pascuas que celebramos los cristianos. Las otras dos son la Pascua de Resurrección (o Pascua Florida) y la Pascua del Nacimiento de Jesús. Estas tres solemnidades cristianas celebran tres momentos claves en el plan de salvación: la Encarnación del Verbo Divino (Jesús), su Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección y el descenso de su Espíritu Santo sobre la Iglesia. Pascua viene siendo el nombre de la principal solemnidad del calendario judío y recuerda la liberación del pueblo de Israel de la esclavitud. Los cristianos hemos tomado ese nombre por reconocernos como descendientes de Abraham y porque en nuestras tres pascuas celebramos que Jesús viene a salvarnos, o sea, a liberarnos del pecado y sus consecuencias tanto personales como sociales. En muchas partes el título de Pascua se ha dejado para hablar de la Fiesta de la Navidad y la Fiesta de Pentecostés. Esto es una lástima ya que el recordar la Pascua debe impulsar al cristiano a obrar por la liberación de todos para que el mundo se salve por Jesucristo.
