Overflow Mass attendees can view Mass in the Memorial Center Gym

We have increased the number of sign ups for the Saturday Vigil and Sunday Masses to 125 per Mass. The Church cannot hold that many with Social Distancing guidelines but now the Mass will be live streamed in the Memorial Center Gym. The gym will be open for people (practicing social distance) to watch the Mass live and receive communion. If there is no space in the Church you will be asked to go to the Gym. To follow the guidelines of the State of California, Yolo County and our diocese, our church can only hold up to 100 people at a time. With the Gym option we can accommodate more people. The same protocols will be followed in the Gym as in the Church. (See below).

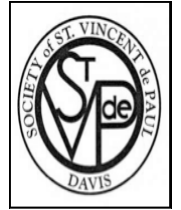

**April 11, 2021– Second Sunday of Easter
(Divine Mercy Sunday)**

In the Gospel today, Jesus stands in the midst of us and says:
“Peace be with you!”

During every Mass we turn to our neighbors saying, “Peace be with you,” and demonstrating recognition that each of us is a member of the body of Christ. And each of us is reaching out for some relief from the burdens of each day, light though they may be. Now, for more than a year, our daily burdens have included the rigors of defending against our contemporary plague: “attending” Mass remotely, separated physically from our families, going about our daily lives while avoiding exposing ourselves and loved ones to the virus. However, we must keep in mind that our God is a loving God whose mercy is unimaginable, and that we must put our full trust in him knowing that he is in charge and he will bring us through this. Our job is not only to keep ourselves safe and healthy but to reach out to those less fortunate in their time of need. How can we as children of God help those who cannot help themselves? Most significantly, we can pray for those at risk. Unfortunately, for many of us, further outreach is difficult if not impossible. In our stead, Vincentian “telephone visitors” are at work every day bringing our needy neighbors peace and hope as well as material assistance. While some of us may have been facing loss of income, let us keep in mind that the poorest of the poor in our world have been suffering this since well before COVID-19. Please pray for our suffering neighbors here and throughout the world.



NEWS FROM THE IRWS



Greetings friends,

As supporters of the Interfaith Rotating Winter Shelter, thank you for your great care and compassion for the unsheltered in Davis. This organization's legacy will be recognized as the rock on which emergency shelter programs for individuals living homeless in Davis was built.

For 13 winters IRWS provided shelter, hot meals, and a friendly face to hundreds of guests. The heartfelt work of the thousands of IRWS volunteers will always hold a proud place in the history of the Davis community.

In recent years, IRWS has discussed ways in which emergency services to the homeless community could be expanded. The advent of COVID19 last year meant that IRWS could not function as it has in the past and a new program was needed.

In the past year IRWS worked hard to secure funding and has been fortunate to receive several grants. These funds have allowed IRWS to hire paid staff to help run our program. A non-congregate setting was necessary, and a local apartment owner gave us access to 25 two-bedroom apartments at a significantly reduced rental rate. In partnership with the City of Davis, CommuniCare, DOVe, and Yolo Food Bank, the Davis Emergency Shelter Program (DESP) was created. Beginning in October 2021, this program has sheltered up to 39 individuals at a time and has moved some participants into permanent housing.

Someone remarked, “I have always thought of IRWS as a program with heart.” And so, we present to you our new name, HEART of Davis. HEART is for Homeless Emergency Assistance and Re-Housing Team. Our new mission statement is: *Assist people experiencing homelessness in the Davis community to obtain shelter, housing & supportive services.* Our vision is to establish a year-round non-congregate emergency shelter, provide support services, and assist those who are looking for housing. Thank you again for all your many years of support, compassion, and friendly faces. We hope you will continue to support our new program.

DOUBT

The desire to be able to prove the existence of a divinity has troubled humanity since human consciousness first became aware of the divine. To this very day we are fond of saying that any number of things—from sunsets to hot fudge sundaes—are “proof that there is a God.” We get so caught up in the story of “doubting Thomas” that we fail to notice that today’s Gospel gives us John’s account of Pentecost, the bestowing of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples following the Resurrection. Thomas, evidently, missed out not only on seeing the Risen Christ, but receiving the Holy Spirit as well. This is not to be taken lightly and, perhaps, makes Thomas’ disbelief a bit easier to comprehend. It also makes his professing that Jesus is his Lord and God—the only time the New Testament explicitly refers to Jesus Christ as “God”—more remarkable.

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FEAST OF FAITH

The Psalms in the Liturgy

The book of Psalms is a prayer book, hymnal, and anthology of verse all rolled into one. It contains one hundred fifty ancient songs—poem-prayers that express the joys and sorrows of the Hebrew people and their longing for God. The psalms are incredibly varied in tone. Some are solemn anthems of praise that once accompanied processions of great multitudes to the temple; others record the lonely cries of a faithful soul who feels abandoned by God.

This ancient prayer book of the Hebrew people is our principal prayer book as well. The psalms are everywhere in the liturgy—in the antiphons and acclamations of the Mass, and most particularly in the responsorial psalm that follows the first reading. The psalm that is sung at Mass usually echoes the themes of the first reading, and sometimes even comments on it. On this Third Sunday of Lent, we listen to the Exodus account of the stubbornness of God’s people in the desert, and then the psalm comes to remind us: “If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts” (Psalm 95:8). In their wonderful variety, the psalms teach us how to pray.

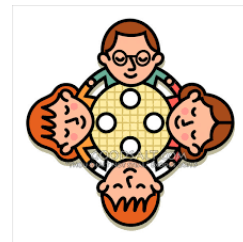
