LITURGICAL TIDBIT

The Final Doxology

"For the Kingdom, the power and glory are yours now and for ever!" Have you ever been curious why some of our Christian brothers and sisters immediately add this phrase after the recitation of the Our Father, while us Catholics say it after the "Deliver us" prayer in mass? This short phrase that is added at the end of the Our Father is called the Final Doxology. The recitation of the Final Doxology has its roots from the Didache, a 1st-2nd century manuscript containing catechetical teaching of the first Christians. It has been a long practice of the Church to add this prayer as a conclusion for the Lord's Prayer. Its purpose is to take up again the first three petitions of the Our Father: the glorification of God's name, the coming of his reign, and the power of his saving will. The evil one has falsely attributed to himself the titles of kingship, power, and glory, so as Jesus Christ restores these attributes to his Father, we too as God's children attribute it to our Father every time we attend mass! So why then do Catholics add the Final Doxology after the "Deliver us" prayer? To put it plainly, although the prayer is very rich in its use in our tradition, it is not original to the Biblical text. You can certainly add the Final Doxology as you privately pray the Our Father to honor this great tradition! In mass, however, we make it clear what is Biblically original and what is part of tradition by having a break between the Lord's Prayer and the Final Doxology.

Today as we celebrate the gift of the Body and Blood of Christ let us pray especially for those suffering from illness



suffering from illness and unable to afford medial care.

Pope Francis says, "There is so much indifference in the face of suffering. May we overcome indifference with concrete acts of charity." All too often, Vincentians are particularly concerned with those in need of housing, food, or utilities payments. Occasionally, we are asked to provide funds for people in need of medical care. For us, the good news is that currently 91% of Americans are medically insured, the highest number of insured Americans since Census began keeping track in 1988. The troubling news is that many of those currently making decisions in in our nation's capital, are doing their best to cut back funding for health care, potentially making it exceedingly difficult for the poor. Many currently able to enroll in health insurance programs will no longer be able to afford to do so. One of the Corporal Works of Mercy is "Visit the Sick." Perhaps we can all do a little better, praying that our nation's policy makers recognize that affordable health care should be a right for each of God's children.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Perú tiene más de 3000 fiestas cada año, normalmente en torno al santo patrón de algún pueblo. La celebración de Corpus Christi es celebrada en todo el país. Pero es más llamativa en Cusco. Durante el día se escucha el repique de María Angola, la campana más grande de todo Perú, que existe desde el siglo XVI.

La celebración incluye una procesión con quince santos y vírgenes del siglo XVII, que vienen desde sus santuarios hasta la barroca Catedral de Cusco para honrar el Cuerpo de Jesús. Estas imágenes son cargadas por la plaza de armas antes de llegar a la catedral donde se quedarán hasta el octavo día. Según los peruanos los santos y vírgenes pasan las siete noches platicando con el Señor de los temblores, bromeando y planificando el año que viene para sus parroquias. El último día los santos y vírgenes regresan a sus santuarios con otra procesión.

Estas dos procesiones nos recuerdan que por mucho que los latinoamericanos amemos y veneremos a los santos y vírgenes reconocemos que tanto ellos como nosotros están al servicio de Cristo Jesús.
