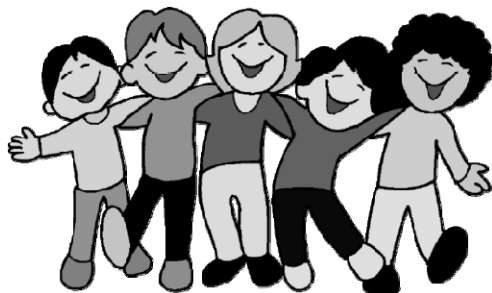

The Sacrament of Reconciliation

As we continue our observance of Lent, it may be helpful to address the sacrament of reconciliation to better prepare ourselves to encounter our risen Lord on Easter. The biggest concern with going to confession nowadays is the question of: "Why do I need to confess my sins to a priest? God alone forgives sins, so in a more direct way, can't I just confess my sins directly to God in prayer?" That question, of course, is valid and has a point. It is correct in saying that God alone forgives sins. The priest, in the spirit of his ordination, simply participates as an instrument of God to impart his forgiveness. It is great to have a conversation to God in prayer about our sins, but to confess our sins and expect forgiveness in a very vague and non-concrete way won't address what needs to be changed and affected in our lives. Whenever we confess our sins in a non-concrete way, we're making God into some vague, cosmological, and spiritual power out there somewhere in the universe that has no tangible effect in our lives. We're also underestimating sin simply as some vague power that has no concrete effect in our lives. Does sin, in fact, have a tangible effect in our life? I think we all know that question answers itself. So just as God had to address our sins by becoming a real and concrete person as Jesus Christ, we also have to address our sins in a real and concrete way through the sacrament of reconciliation. Only when we address our sins in a concrete way, can the forgiveness of God start to affect and change what needs to be reconciled in our life.

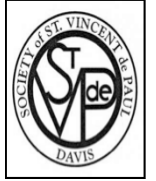
School — Parish Connection

April 21—Easter Sunday



As we celebrate the feast of Easter we are confronted with the challenge of seeing and believing the resurrection that comes through our own lives of self-sacrifice, bringing new life to others. As we review our Lenten sacrifices, let us work to help fellow Americans suffering from hunger.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Catholic Charities USA, and the USCCB encourage Catholics to act to protect the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), our nation's foremost anti-hunger program. Each year SNAP lifts millions of low-income Americans out of food insecurity. However, a recent proposed rule from the USDA to increase SNAP work requirements would limit what states can do to adapt to the needs of low-income and working families. As a result of these changes more than 755,000 individuals would lose SNAP benefits over the next three years. This means less local control, more food insecurity and more people in need. Please consider contacting the USDA to express your concern and to ask that it withdraw or modify the rule so that it protects access to necessary food and nutrition programs (SNAP Program Development Division Food and Nutrition Service, USDA 3101 Park Center Drive, Alexandria, VA 22302).

ST. JAMES PANCAKE BREAKFAST!

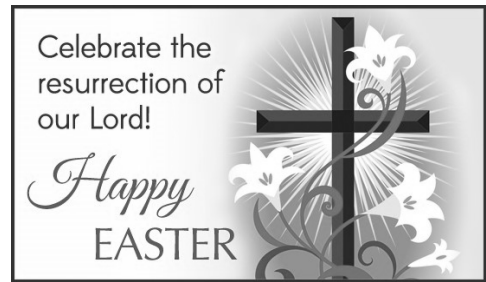

SPEND TIME WITH OUR LORD DURING LENT

Lent is a special time to draw closer to our Lord by visiting Him in Eucharistic Adoration. There you will find peace, hope and quiet time to escape from the daily distractions of our everyday lives. As in the words of Monsignor William Reyna, "When I visit the Blessed Sacrament, it is I who go to the Savior in order to rest with Him awhile. How good it feels!. How beneficial for the wary mind to go aside a little from society".

Adoration is held on Mondays from 8 am to 5 pm (closes at 5 with a special Eucharistic benediction) and on Thursdays from 6 pm to 9 pm.

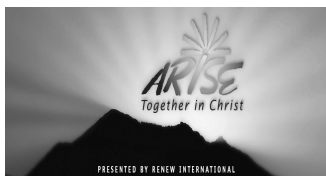
OBLATION AND INTERCESSION

How fortunate we are in our parish that we have the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Every Monday from 7:30 a.m. to 5 the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for our adoration in the Chapel. Also Thursday evenings from 6 to 9 p.m. Jesus is present, waiting for adorers. Eventually more days will be available as the need for other days become apparent.

Many holy people and saints have gone before us who made time to spend silent and prayerful times with Jesus. For example, St. Alphonsus Liguori from the 18th century was often rapt in ecstasy before the Blessed Sacrament. He made frequent visits. One of his simple but favorite prayers was: "O my God, my Love, O everlasting Love, I love Thee!" During his life he wrote many prayers for Adoration which were translated into numerous languages. He often said that next to Holy Communion that no act of worship is so pleasing to God and none so useful as the frequent visit to our Lord Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament dwelling upon our altars. All people are invited for worship – the young and the old. Some entire families have been seen in our chapel during Adoration. What an excellent example for the young!

If Jesus were actually visible in our church, everyone would run to welcome him, but he remains hidden in the Sacred Host under the appearance of bread, because he is calling us to faith, that many may come to him in humility. "The Blessed Sacrament is the "Living Heart" of each of our churches and it is our very sweet duty to honor and adore the Blessed Host, which our eyes see, -the Incarnate Word, whom they cannot see." (Pope Paul VI).

"ARISE Together in Christ" takes inspiration from the words of Fr. Giltus Mathias, C.P. the Executive Director of Christ the King Retreat Center.



He states, "In a world that constantly projects pain, sorrow, tragedy and tears, Easter reminds us that life is worth living. Easter reminds us that every Good Friday in our lives will have an Easter Sunday and that Jesus will let us share the power of His Resurrection. Each time we display our love of others, we share in the Resurrection. Each time we face a betrayal of trust, we share in the Resurrection of Jesus. Each time we fail in our attempts to ward off temptations—but keep on trying to overcome them—we share in the Resurrection. Each time we continue to hope—even when our hope seems unanswered—we share in the power of Jesus' Resurrection. The message of Easter is that nothing can destroy us—not pain, sin, rejection or death—because Christ has conquered all of these, and we too can conquer them if we put our Faith in Him." Have a Blessed Easter everyone! Peace be with you!

TEMPORADA DE FLU

Precauciones para evitar el contagio. El Departamento de Salud Pública de California ha reportado que la incidencia del Flu y enfermedades similares ha llegado a un extremo en que se deben aplicar medidas para evitar contagios durante la Misa.

Para proteger la salud y bienestar de todos, el Obispo Soto ha emitido los siguientes mandatos:

- El uso del Cáliz de la Comunión se suspende temporalmente.
- Recibir el Cuerpo de Cristo en la mano. (aunque recibirlo en la lengua está permitido)
- No darse la mano. Ofrecer el signo de paz con una inclinación de la cabeza diciendo "la paz este contigo."
- No tomarse de la mano durante el Padrenuestro.
- Los ministros de la Eucaristía deben limpiarse las manos con un antiséptico a base de alcohol antes y después de administrar la Sagrada Comunión a los que visitan en sus casas.

La asistencia a Misa los domingos y días festivos no es obligatoria para los enfermos. Si estás enfermo, quédate en casa y cuídate.

Gracia por su paciencia y comprensión durante esta temporada. Rueda por los enfermos. La Sagrada Comunión por los dos medios retornará cuando el Señor Obispo lo juzgue prudente.

LA HISTORIA DE NUESTRA REDENCIÓN

Empezamos la última semana de Cuaresma con estas lecturas ya conocidas. Este año, el Domingo de Ramos escuchamos la narración de la Pasión tomada del Evangelio de Lucas. Estas lecturas para el Domingo de Ramos y la Pasión solían leerse los domingos sucesivos. Ahora están combinadas en una sola celebración, para que así podamos ver toda la extensión de la gloria y el sufrimiento llevado a cabo. Jesús acepta la adulación de la gente, el anuncio de su gloria en la Resurrección. Él se despidió de sus discípulos en su última pascua; y perdona a sus verdugos cuando muere en la cruz. Más adelante esta semana, entramos al Triduo Pascual de Jueves Santo, Viernes Santo y Sábado Santo, cuando toda la historia de nuestra redención se haga realidad.
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TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

La liturgia oficial de la Iglesia para el Domingo de Ramos es algo paradójica. Entramos proclamando Hosannas con cantos y vitorias y al poco tiempo estamos gritando: ¡crucifícalo, crucifícalo! Según el rito la lectura del Evangelio y la consagración de la Eucaristía se hacen dentro del templo, pero se comienza afuera del templo con la bendición de los ramos.

En los Estados Unidos y otros países latinoamericanos se usan palmas en lugar de ramos. En Europa, normalmente, se usan ramos de olivos. Últimamente en Colombia para proteger la palma de cera del Quindío, se les ha pedido a los fieles que usen ramitas de plantas o ramos de flores. Estoy de acuerdo hay que proteger el ambiente, pero admito que prefiero las palmas, ya que es difícil poner un ramo de olivo o de flores detrás de una imagen sagrada colgada en la pared. Esta es una costumbre latina que nos recuerda que los hosannas y el crucifícalo del domingo de ramos nos acompañan todos los días del año.
