2019 LENTEN REGULATIONS

Lent is a season in which the faithful are called to reflect on the Paschal Mystery in a particularly focused way. It is a time of spiritual renewal and to carefully examine one's relationship with God and others. It is also a time in which catechumens prepare to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. The Church calls everyone, therefore, to a spirit of penance through the traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE.

-All persons, 14 years and older, are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Other forms of abstinence, including abstinence from alcoholic beverages, television, video games, the internet and social media during and other electronic devices Lent is spiritually beneficial.

-Everyone from ages 18 to 59 is obliged to **fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent, especially on Wednesdays and Fridays, is highly recommended. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, neither the law of fasting nor the law of abstinence obliges. If in doubt, one's parish priest or confessor should be consulted.

PRAYER

-Catholics are urged to read and pray with sacred Scripture more intently during Lent. The faithful are encouraged to participate in special devotions offered by the parish, especially parish penance services and Eucharistic adoration. Other devotions such as the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, visits to the Blessed Sacrament, and praying for vocations to the priesthood and religious life are also encouraged.

-The Stations of the Cross are to be celebrated in each parish on Fridays during Lent and everyone is encouraged to attend.

ALMSGIVING

-All Catholics are urged to give generously to assist the poor and support the charitable works of the Church, especially through their local parish and the Annual Catholic Appeal.

-The faithful are also encouraged to visit the sick, the homebound, the aged, and those in prison, remembering the words of our Lord Jesus Christ who said, "As you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me." (Matthew 25:40). Fasting and abstinence together with almsgiving and charitable works unites us to the crucified Christ reflected in the image of our brothers and sisters who suffer.

The Catholic Herald

Among the topics addressed in feature stories are the diocese's Pastoral Care Coordinator, who is available to assist persons who have suffered sexual abuse by members of the Catholic clergy or other church personnel; the role of the diocese's Independent Review Board in accessing allegations of sexual abuse; the application process, formation and evaluation of men pursuing a priestly vocation for the diocese; and a special message to the faithful by Bishop Jaime Soto and frequently-asked questions.

Liturgical Tidbit By Fr. Joshua Sia

The Sacrament of Reconciliation

As we continue our observance of Lent, it may be helpful to address the sacrament of reconciliation to better prepare ourselves to encounter our risen Lord on Easter. The biggest concern with going to confession nowadays is the question of: "Why do I need to confess my sins to a priest? God alone forgives sins, so in a more direct way, can't I just confess my sins directly to God in prayer?" That question, of course, is valid and has a point. It is correct in saying that God alone forgives sins. The priest, in the spirit of his ordination, simply participates as an instrument of God to impart his forgiveness. It is great to have a conversation to God in prayer about our sins, but to confess our sins and expect forgiveness in a very vague and non-concrete way won't address what needs to be changed and affected in our lives. Whenever we confess our sins in a non-concrete way, we're making God into some vague, cosmological, and spiritual power out there somewhere in the universe that has no tangible effect in our lives. We're also underestimating sin simply as some vague power that has no concrete effect in our lives. Does sin, in fact, have a tangible effect in our life? I think we all know that question answers itself. So just as God had to address our sins by becoming a real and concrete person as Jesus Christ, we also have to address our sins in a real and concrete way through the sacrament of reconciliation. Only when we address our sins in a concrete way, can the forgiveness of God start to affect and change what needs to be reconciled in our life.

School — Parish Connection

St. James School began our Lenten journey by celebrating Ash Wednesday Mass together as a school and parish community. As Catholics, we are called to love our neighbor. During this Lenten season, we are invited to reflect on how an encounter with our neighbor, as companions on life's journeys, can be transformative. We will see how our prayers, fasting, and almsgiving can support others. Through prayer, we encounter Christ, present in the faces of every member of our human family, so often still walking that long road to Calvary. Through fasting, we encounter our own obstacles, those things about ourselves that prevent us from loving God and neighbor. Through almsgiving, we encounter our brothers and sisters around the world, asking what we can give up so that others might have life to the fullest. As a school community, our students received the Sacrament of Reconciliation, celebrated Stations of the Cross, and participated in Lenten classroom activities. We will continue our journey as our 8th graders will reenact the "Passion Play," a para-liturgical prayer service held on Holy Thursday. This is a beautiful school tradition that helps our students prepare for Easter.

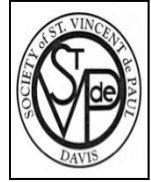
April 14—Palm Sunday of the Lord's

TEMPORADA DE FLU

Precauciones para evitar el contagio.

El Departamento de Salud Publica de California ha reportado que la incidencia del Flu y enfermedades similares ha llegado a un extremo en que se deben aplicar medidas para evitar contagios durante la Misa.

Para proteger la salud y bienestar de todos, el Obispo Soto ha emitido los siguientes mandatos:

- El uso del Cáliz de la Comunión se suspende temporalmente.
- Recibir el Cuerpo de Cristo en la mano. (aunque recibirlo en la lengua esta permitido)
- No darse la mano. Ofrecer el signo de paz con una inclinación de la cabeza diciendo "la paz este contigo."
- No tomarse de la mano durante el Padrenuestro.
- Los ministros de la Eucaristía deben limpiarse las manos con un antiséptico a base de alcohol antes y después de administrar la Sagrada Comunión a los que visitan en sus casas.

La asistencia a Misa los domingos y días festivos no es obligatoria para los enfermos. Si estás enfermo, quédate en casa y cuídate.

Gracia por su paciencia y comprensión durante esta temporada. Rueda por los enfermos. La Sagrada Comunión por los dos medios retornará cuando el Señor Obispo lo juzgue prudente.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

La liturgia oficial de la Iglesia para el Domingo de Ramos es algo paradójica. Entramos proclamando Hosannas con cantos y vitoreas y al poco tiempo estamos gritando: ¡crucifícalo, crucifícalo! Según el rito la lectura del Evangelio y la consagración de la Eucaristía se hacen dentro del templo, pero se comienza afuera del templo con la bendición de los ramos.

En los Estados Unidos y otros países latinoamericanos se usan palmas en lugar de ramos. En Europa, normalmente, se usan ramos de olivos. Últimamente en Colombia para proteger la palma de cera del Quindío, se les ha pedido a los fieles que usen ramitas de plantas o ramos de flores. REGLAMENTOS CUAESMALES DEL 2019

El 6 de marzo de 2019, Miércoles de Ceniza, emprendemos otra vez el recorrido cuaresmal durante el cual procuramos profundizar nuestra conversión. La cuaresma nos prepara para celebrar el Misterio Pascual de la pasión, muerte y resurrección de Cristo. Es tiempo de reflexión y renovación espiritual, tiempo de examinar nuestra relación con Dios y con los demás. También es un momento en el cual los catecúmenos se preparan para recibir el Sacramento de Iniciación en la Vigilia Pascual. La Iglesia también llama a los católicos a adoptar un espíritu de penitencia, especialmente la práctica de los "Actos Religiosos": el ayuno, la oración y la limosna.

AYUNO Y ABSTINENCIA

Abstinencia: Todas las personas que hayan cumplido los 14 años de edad tienen la obligación de **abstenerse de comer carne el miércoles de Ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma**. Otras formas de abstinencia durante la Cuaresma serían: abstenerse de bebidas alcohólicas, televisión, videojuegos, internet, redes sociales y otros dispositivos electrónicos. La Cuaresma es espiritualmente beneficiosa.

Ayuno: Todas las personas, de 18 años hasta los 59, tienen la obligación de **ayunar el miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo**. El ayuno es opcional en otros días de la cuaresma, especialmente los miércoles y viernes, es sumamente recomendable.

En casos en que peligre la salud o la capacidad de trabajo, no se aplican las leyes del ayuno y abstinencia. Si se tienen dudas al respecto, se ha de consultar con un sacerdote de la parroquia o con un confesor.

ORACIÓN

Con el fin de profundizar nuestro amor por Cristo, los católicos debemos orar y meditar las Sagradas Escrituras; participar en los actos piadosos que ofrezca nuestra parroquia; y orar con mayor fervor individualmente, en familia y en comunión con otras personas. A los fieles se les exhorta a que recen el rosario, visiten al Santísimo Sacramento y oren, especialmente por las vocaciones al sacerdocio y a la vida consagrada, y por la paz mundial.

LIMOSNA

Todos los católicos se les pide que ayuden generosamente a las obras caritativas de la Iglesia, incluyendo las contribuciones regulares a su parroquia y a la Campaña Católica Anual. Se les invita también a que ayuden de diferentes maneras a los enfermos, a los necesitados, a los ancianos y encarcelados. El ayuno y la abstinencia junto con las obras de caridad ayudan al católico a vivir en solidaridad con Cristo crucificado reflejado en la imagen de sus hermanos y hermanas que sufren.
