A special message from our Pastor, Fr. Rey:

During this period of the COVID-19 pandemic I request prayers for all who are suffering and that the financial needs of our parish and parishioners are met.

Pope Francis recently reminded us we will survive this coronavirus situation by sticking together. He invites us to live this moment with humility, penance, compassion and hope, and to demonstrate our solidarity with others; especially those who suffer.

Yes, these are dark times for many of us. Yet our faith commends us to not be consumed by fear, insecurity, and anxiety. As followers of Jesus, we put our trust in God who, in the power of the Holy Spirit, sends us to be about God's mission of restoration, reconciliation and wholeness in the face of brokenness, alienation, and illness.

Now is the time for us to be the Church that God wants us and needs us to be.

Rather than live in fear, let us together approach this challenge in faith. We have an opportunity to model each other what a faith-filled and faithful response can be. We must remain rational, reasoned and to approach this pandemic in a spirit of trust. It may well impact our families and the lives of those we love. Be careful. Be cautious. Be wise and practical in what you do. But do not live in fear.

What I do fear, more than COVID-19, is that we will forget who we are and to whom we belong.

Yes, we need to rely on health professionals for advice and best practices. Yet, we need to entrust our lives to Christ. Have confidence our Faith gives us the strength to overcome the challenges confronting us today. And then we need to step back - stay centered and remind each other we belong to Christ.

The pandemic has changed so much of our daily lives for the time-being. But it has not changed our need to carry on as the St. James community, supporting our Catholic faith and ministries.

Here at St. James our vibrant ministries, faith formation and Catholic education have been severely disrupted by the pandemic. Limitations on weekend Mass participation have impacted our sense of community with a concurrent reduction of 25% in parish income.

Understandably, this has placed a tremendous strain on our ability to operate and maintain our parish facilities.

So, my friends today I humbly ask for your generous financial support. For those having reduced or suspended contributions to our parish please resume your ongoing support. For those having not been impacted by COVID-19 and are in a position to do so, I ask your consideration of increasing your support. And, for those presently unable to contribute, please pray for all of us and a future of vibrant liturgy, ministry and service to our Community of Faith. I encourage you to peruse this website and review the various ways you can help support our Community of Faith.

Dear St. James Parishioners,

We will be celebrating two(2) Outside Masses on Sundays, English at 8am and Spanish at 9am every weekend. The Masses will be celebrated on the patio between the Memorial Center and the School (behind the mural of St. Francis).

We are working hard to make sure everything is clean and safe for everyone. The following are the Procedures that need to be followed to make sure we are in compliance with the county and state.

Register for Mass

You **must** pre-register for Mass and the limit is 40 people per Mass. There is a Sign Up Genius link on our website (<https://www.signupgenius.com/go/10c0e44aeae2ca2f58-stjames>). Just click on the link and follow the directions to sign up. Or call the office at (530-756-3636) M-F, 8 am to 3pm and sign up on the phone.

The deadline to sign up for the outside Masses is the Friday before the Mass at 12pm.

Rules and Procedures

We also ask you to follow these rules to keep everyone healthy:

- If you are sick, please stay home.
- Come 10-15 minutes early.
- You will need time to check in, have your temperature taken, use hand sanitizer, and be ushered to your seat.
- Use the bathroom at home before Mass. Bathrooms will be unavailable.
- If you need water during Mass, please bring your own.
- You may bring your own hand sanitizer and wipes, if you prefer.
- Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth at all times. No gloves, please.
- Keep social distance of 6 feet at all times.

The Vincentian Corner
September 13 — Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The challenge in today's Responsorial Psalm is to remember that "The Lord is kind and merciful, slow to anger, and rich in compassion."

As we read in the book of Sirach, "Could anyone refuse mercy to another like himself?" Now, as our community, our nation, and our world struggle during a time of pandemic, social and political unrest, and natural disasters such as wildfires and hurricanes, and at a time when many of us have not been able to attend Mass or receive the Blessed Sacrament for months, it is time to turn both to prayer and to acts of charity to fulfill our Christian calling for love and mercy, keeping in mind that while we, ourselves, may sometimes feel lost and forgotten, there are some in our community who are in even greater need of love and kindness. For almost twenty years, the St. James Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul has served as the charitable arm of our parish. As we approach the end of our seventeenth fiscal year, we can look back on years of channeling hundreds of thousands of dollars from St. James parishioners to those in desperate circumstances. Truly, the needy of Davis and elsewhere in Yolo County have benefitted from the great generosity of the St. James community. Let us keep our needy neighbors in our hearts and prayers. Let us find in ourselves the ability to be "rich in compassion."

Some of Deacon Sam's Random Thoughts and Prayers during this time of COVID-19

--Resilience is the ability to adapt well in the face of adversity and is made possible with faith in God who provides hope.

--St. Joseph was an imperfect individual who lived with 2 perfect individuals: Jesus, the Son of God and Mary, the Mother of God. He was most likely afraid on 3 major occasions:

Should he divorce a pregnant woman?

Fleeing to Egypt with his wife and Son to escape Herod.

Looking for his Son in the temple.

His obedience and faith in God helped him succeed with these events. What an outstanding role model he is for us at this time!

--Jesus gave His greatest sermon from the pulpit of the Cross when He said "Father forgive them."

Jesus wants us to love others-no "ifs" or "buts".

When people see us, do they see Jesus?

I pray: "Jesus, you hold on to me and I hold on to you."

--Tips for Praying:

Find a place to pray that's quiet.

Make an altar with a candle, Bible, devotional book and image of Jesus.

Think about God and offer our works to Him.

Thank God for His gifts and give Him praise.

Come to Jesus like children--a son or a daughter --and love God with all our heart and strength.

I pray: "Lord Jesus, embrace my soul in your heart.

Bless me in life and death that I may praise you for all eternity in heaven. Amen."

--The Psalms start out with a deep cry out to the Lord-anger, anxiety, fear, sadness, etc. and end with words of hope. It is suffering that expands the capacity of the human heart to love. We should each have a hunger and thirst for God. It is not that I live, it is Jesus who lives within me. When people see me-or anyone of us, do they see Jesus? Jesus, imprint your face in our hearts so we can see you in all people. Our lives are meant to mirror Christ's life. May we, O Lord, each be a reflection of your glory in the world.

--Gratitude is the first sign of a rational creature. We should live in a perpetual act of thanksgiving to the Lord. Thank God ahead of time for His future gifts to each of us.

I ask: "Why me Lord?

What did I do to deserve all you have given me?"

--Real poverty is to be unaware or unmoved by the presence of God in our lives.

The greatest suffering is to think -- and believe -- that our life has no meaning.

--What are we doing while we are waiting?

Jesus knocks on the door of our hearts waiting for us to open them to Him by our prayers and good works.

What are we waiting for?

People are brought to conversion when they see the Life of Christ in others.

--In the dark moments of our lives we pray that God will stay with us.

"Cuando tomó Jesús el vinagre, dijo: «Todo está cumplido.»
E inclinando la cabeza entregó el espíritu."

Juan 19:30

El Evangelio del Domingo 24 del tiempo ordinario (A), nos presenta la imagen de la cárcel de los deudores. En la antigüedad las prisiones eran principalmente para los que tenían deudas sin saldar. Los que cometían algún otro crimen eran condenados a muerte, por lo tanto, la cárcel era solo para los deudores.

Si el deudor no pagaba la deuda era enviado a la prisión de los deudores. En las paredes de la prisión se escribía la lista de deudas que debía ser saldada. Naturalmente, desde la prisión era complicado adquirir el financiamiento necesario para saldar la deuda. Por lo tanto, la única forma de salir de prisión era si alguien más acudía en nombre del deudor a pagar su deuda.

Una vez que se saldaba la deuda, se escribía la palabra *Tetelestai* sobre la lista de deudas que había sido escrito en la pared de la prisión. *Tetelestai* es una palabra griega que significa deuda saldada. Esta palabra griega también significa; "Consumado es," o "Todo está cumplido."

"Todo está cumplido," nos remite inmediatamente al Evangelio de San Juan al momento de la crucifixión. El evangelista nos narra que "...cuando tomó Jesús el vinagre, dijo: «Todo está cumplido.» E inclinando la cabeza entregó el espíritu." (Juan 19:30) Para expresar que "todo está cumplido" en el idioma original en el que el evangelio fue escrito se utiliza la palabra *Tetelestai*, que significa; deuda pagada en su totalidad.

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas cada que pecamos ofendemos a Dios nuestro Padre que es un Dios eterno, por lo tanto, incurrimos en una deuda que es eterna. Y siendo realistas no existe forma alguna que podamos saldar una deuda que es eterna. Indudablemente que todos necesitamos de un redentor, de alguien que redima nuestra deuda.

Y esto es precisamente lo que nuestro Señor Jesucristo realiza en la cruz, nos redime, paga nuestra deuda. Desde lo alto de la cruz Nuestro Señor exclama *Tetelestai*. Anunciando al mundo y a la creación entera que la deuda ha sido pagada en su totalidad. Esto es lo que Dios nos da y nos ofrece, su perdón.

Perdón que no merecemos, perdón que nada de lo que hagamos nos hará dignos. Pero Dios libremente nos da su perdón sin ninguna condición. Y bien lo dice el dicho que no podemos dar lo que no tenemos. Así que si hay alguien en tu vida que necesite de tu perdón primero recibe y experimenta el perdón de Dios. Después ve y haz lo mismo con los que necesiten de tu perdón.

"Les doy un mandamiento nuevo, dice el Señor:
que se amen los unos a los otros, como yo los he amado."

La fecha límite para registrarse es el viernes a las 2:00pm.

Reglas y Procedimientos.

También les pedimos que sigan estas reglas para mantener la salud de todos:

Si se siente enfermo, por favor quédese en casa.

Llegue 10 -15 minutos antes de la hora.

Necesita tiempo para anotarse, tomar su temperatura, usar el desinfectante en las manos y ser acompañado a su sitio.

Use su baño en casa antes de la Misa. Los baños no van a estar disponibles.

Si necesita tomar agua durante la Misa, traiga la suya.

Puede traer su propio desinfectante si lo prefiere.

Use la máscara que cubre nariz y boca, todo el tiempo. Por favor no use guantes.

Mantenga su distancia de 6 pies todo el tiempo.

La dispensa del Obispo Soto sigue en pie.

Si usted no se siente bien o todavía no está listo para venir a Misa, no tiene que hacerlo. Continuaremos con la Misa electrónica todos los días. Entre a la página de St. James y oprima el botón de "youtube".
