WELCOME TO MASS IN THE ST JAMES CHURCH PARKING LOT

Smart phone or tablet: Make sure your data is turned on: go to Settings, Cellular, and Turn Cellular Data ON. **Charges will apply.** With the camera of your smartphone, take a “picture” of the QR block above, then tap the white box that appears at the top of the image. That should take you to the St. James YouTube channel. Today’s live stream video will be at the top of the listed videos.

Radio option: If you do not have a smart phone or tablet (**or if you do not want to use data**): Tune your radio to **FM 89.1**.

For those who join the mass virtually in the parking lot, you may receive Holy Communion at the appropriate time in your parked car or while standing, socially distanced, at one of the pillars in front of the Memorial Center.

To receive Holy Communion at the appropriate moment of the Mass, turn on your blinking hazard lights (usually a red button on your dashboard with a triangle symbol) to signal the presider or minister. Roll down your window with your mask on; hold out your hand, palm up to receive; consume; roll up your window; and turn off your hazard lights as a signal that you have received. Those standing at the pillars should wait for the minister to come to you. After the final blessing, please use the exit closest to the school. There will be a volunteer at the exit with a donation basket. You may put your envelope, check, or cash in the basket as you depart the parking lot. Or you can send your check to

AN ANCIENT BAPTISTERY

One of the most ancient and enduring sites for baptism in Rome is the church of San Giovanni in Fonte. This church is in fact a baptistery, and houses the font for the Lateran Basilica, the cathedral of Rome. The Emperor Constantine sponsored its construction in the year 315, and it is therefore the oldest baptistery in the world. It is the model for nearly all later baptisteries, including perhaps the font in your own parish church.

FEAST OF FAITH

The Sign of the Cross

At the beginning of our prayer, we make the sign of the cross together. This sign, simple and powerful, operates on many levels. We trace the sign of the cross over our bodies, reminding ourselves that the cross of Christ has become our source of resurrection, life, and grace. With this sign, we also profess our faith in the Trinity: the presider does not say “in the names,” but “in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit”—three persons, one God. The sign of the cross is also a baptismal reminder, for every sign of the cross echoes the words spoken over us at our baptism, which marked our entry into the saving mystery of Christ. This many-layered sign is also our primary sign of blessing: the cross is traced over people, places, and things upon which we ask God to impart divine benediction.

In blessing ourselves with the sign of the cross at the beginning of Mass, we acknowledge the mystery that has gathered us together: that Christ, the crucified and risen One, is living, and that we are members of his Body. Our response, our Amen, is our yes to all this, our first profession of faith.

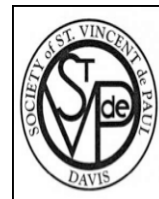

January 10 - The Baptism of the Lord:



"Poverty calls us to sow hope...Poverty is the flesh of the poor Jesus, in that child who is hungry, in the one who is sick, in those unjust social structures."
(Pope Francis)

For the past 50 years, January has been designated Poverty Awareness Month by a partnership of the Catholic Campaign for Human Development and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. St. Vincent de Paul made it his life's work to serve those he called his "masters," the poor, who as Jesus has said "you will always have with you." (John 12:8). Serving the poor is the central aspect of the Vincentian charism, and so, the Vincentian Corner will focus on poverty for the rest of this month. Even before the COVID-19 pandemic struck our world, poverty was, undoubtedly, the most significant social problem faced around the globe. Poverty is defined by the World Bank as a "pronounced deprivation in well-being", and a shocking 80 percent of the world's population survives on less than 10 dollars a day. That is almost 6 billion people living in poverty worldwide. 10 percent of our brothers and sisters around the world (just over 700 million people) are living on less than \$1.90 a day, the World Bank's international line for extreme poverty. Children and youth account for two-thirds of the world's poor, and women represent a majority in most regions. Please consider including the world's poor in your daily prayers this month.

LAS AGUAS BAUTISMALES

Cuando se planta un césped nuevo, debe regarse constantemente. Los jardineros dicen que esto “teje” el césped al suelo. Lo mismo sucede cuando se injerta una rama a un árbol: el cataplasma que los une debe estar húmedo en todo momento. El agua es lo que mantiene unidas a las células de nuestro cuerpo. Con razón las religiones de todas las épocas y culturas han usado tanto este símbolo. Cuando Jesús se sumerge en el Jordán para ser bautizado, se “teje” a todo aquello que lo precedía. Al sumergirse en el Jordán, se hizo uno con el pueblo de Israel que había cruzado el río para llegar a su Tierra Prometida. Junto a Juan Bautista, Cristo se tejió a la tradición profética que presagiaba la venida del Reino de Dios. Jesús se había convertido plenamente en humano en las aguas del vientre de María y al participar del rito del Bautismo del arrepentimiento, se sintió identificado con nuestra frágil y pecaminosa humanidad. Por las aguas del Bautismo Cristo continúa injertando nuevos miembros a su Cuerpo, la Iglesia; gracias a nuestro destino de vida eterna, por estas aguas somos limpiados del pecado y recibimos la promesa de la gracia. San Ignacio de Loyola enfatizaba mucho la necesidad de encontrar a Dios en todo, no porque Dios estuviera perdido o ausente, sino porque las personas no siempre son conscientes de su presencia en ellas o entre ellas. Por ello, no venimos como individuos aislados, sino como miembros de un solo cuerpo; no comulgamos para vivir la comunión, sino que comulgamos porque vivimos la comunión en medio de nuestra gran diversidad. Somos asamblea convocada, cuerpo vivo y santo que se hará sacrificio de alabanza.

UN ANTIGUO BAUTISTERIO

En Roma está uno de los lugares para bautizar más antiguos que ha permanecido a lo largo de los siglos, está en la iglesia de san Giovanni in Fonte. De hecho la iglesia es el bautisterio y ahí está la pila bautismal de la Basílica de Letrán, la catedral de Roma. El emperador romano Constantino patrocinó la construcción en el año 315 por lo que lo hace el bautisterio más antiguo del mundo. Su edificación es modelo para todos los bautisterios que se construyeron después, incluyendo quizá la pila bautismal que puede haber en tu propia parroquia.

Esto debe llevarlo al canal de St. James en YouTube. El video en vivo de la Misa de hoy estará en la parte superior de la lista de videos.

Opción de radio: Si usted no tiene celular inteligente o tableta (**o si usted no quiere usar sus datos**): Sintonice su radio en **FM 89.1**.

Para los que participan de la misa virtualmente desde el estacionamiento, pueden recibir la Comunión en el momento apropiado de la Misa, dentro de su carro o de pie, guardando la distancia social, colocándose en uno de los pilares enfrente del Memorial Center.

Para recibir la Comunión en el momento apropiado de la Misa, encienda las luces intermitentes o de emergencia (normalmente un botón rojo en el tablero de su coche, con un triángulo). Póngase su cubrebocas, baje la ventana, extienda su mano con las palmas hacia arriba para recibir; consuma; suba su ventana y apague las luces de emergencia en señal de que ya recibió la Comunión. Los que se encuentren de pie en los pilares deben esperar a que el Ministro de Eucaristía vaya a ellos.
