Lent is a call not just to "give up something" but more important To "do something."

As we have noted before in this space, some years ago, Bishop Ken Untener of Saganaw, Michigan (originator of the "Little Books" many of us use during Advent, Lent, and Easter), issued this decree during the annual Chrism Mass: "For the next three months, any meeting held in the diocese no matter how large or how small, should begin with the question, How will what we are about to do affect the poor?" This Lent consider each day asking yourself, "What can I do to affect the poor?" Most of us living in Davis have comfortable lives. We have our own homes. Food and clothing are not issues for us. We have jobs or live on our retirement plans. But not everyone is so fortunate. Wherever you live in our parish, there are poor families within walking distance of your home. Many of them are not homeless but live constantly on the edge of losing their homes. They are the "invisible poor." We may never see them because we don't know where to look. Perhaps this will be the Lent where you dedicate yourself to finding those in your neighborhood who need help. Otherwise, you might consider joining the St. James Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. And help us help the invisible poor who reach out to us every day. St. James School-Parish Connection, February 20-21, 2021

This school year St. James School children have been learning about St. Thomas Aquinas' cardinal virtues and daughter virtues with the *Education in Virtue* program. During the month of February, we will focus our learning on **Justice**. Justice is the cardinal virtue that perfects our will and all our relationships with others, including family, country, and Church. It is the constant and firm will to give to each what is his due. It disposes us to respect the rights and dignity of others, leading to harmony and equality in human interactions. Justice toward God is the virtue of religion. The just Christian is motivated by charity, a sincere will to not only give to others what is their due, but to will the good for them.

As we enter this Lenten season, we will be targeting the daughter virtues of **Generosity, Gratitude, Kindness, Prayerfulness, Respect, and Sincerity**.

In the words of St. Pope John Paul II: *It is necessary, therefore, to deepen our knowledge of justice continually. It is not a theoretical science. It is virtue, it is capacity of the human spirit, of the human will and also of the heart. It is also necessary to pray in order to be just and to know how to be just. We cannot forget Our Lord's words: "The measure you give will be the measure you get" (Matthew 7:2). A just man is a man of a "just measure."*

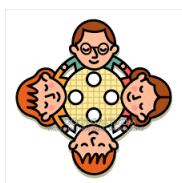
SMALL GROUP FAITH SHARING

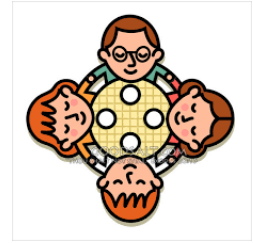

ARREPIÉNTANSE Y CREEN EN EL EVANGELIO

La Cuaresma es la época del año que dedicamos a examinar nuestras vidas a la luz de nuestro Bautismo en la muerte y Resurrección de Jesús. Las lecturas de hoy son un catecismo abreviado de lo que significa estar bautizados. Como Noé pasó por las aguas del diluvio a una alianza con Dios, así también nosotros entramos en una alianza, una relación con Dios, mediante nuestro Bautismo.

La carta de Pedro da una explicación explícita de lo que nuestro Bautismo significa: un llamamiento que hacemos a Dios para que nos dé una conciencia tranquila. ¿Cómo podemos obtener esta conciencia tranquila? Las palabras proclamadas por Jesús inmediatamente después de su tentación nos muestran cómo:

“Arrepiéntanse y crean en el Evangelio” (Marcos 1:15). Podría ser un buen ejercicio espiritual mantener estas lecturas ante nosotros durante todo el tiempo de Cuaresma, un medio que nos ayude a volver a una vida vivida por las promesas bautismales.
