Just click on the link and follow the directions to sign up. Or call the office at (530-756-3636) M-F, 8 am to 3pm and sign up on the phone. The deadline to sign up for the Masses is the Friday before the Mass at 12pm.

We are working hard to make sure everything is clean and safe for everyone.

The following are the procedures that need to be followed to make sure we are in compliance with the county and state.

- If you are sick, please stay home.
- Come 10-15 minutes early.
- You will need time to check in, have your temperature taken, use hand sanitizer, and be ushered to your seat.

SAINT ROSE PHILIPPINE DUCHESNE (1769-1852) November 18

Pope Benedict once declared himself struck by how remarkably diverse our American saints are—some native born: Mother Seton, Katherine Drexel, Kateri Tekakwitha; most, like many Catholics today, immigrants: Padre Serra, Bishop Neumann, Mother Cabrini, Rose Philippine Duchesne. When the French Revolution that dispersed her convent ended, Rose joined the Religious of the Sacred Heart, volunteering for their United States mission, opening the first free school west of the Mississippi. Only after lengthy service as Superior did Rose—now seventy-one—realize her life's dream, undertaking a mission among the Potawatomi Indians. When some worried about her advanced age and failing health, the Jesuit mission leader overruled them: "She must come! She may not be able to do much work, but she'll bring the mission success by praying for us!" Frustrated by her inability to learn their languages, Rose nevertheless "spoke" to the Native Americans by her prayerful presence before the tabernacle. "Quah-kah-ka-num-ad," they named her, "Woman-Who-Prays-Always"—their way of bestowing the title the Church would later make official: saint!—Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

The Vincentian Corner

November 8, 2020
Thirty-Second Sunday
in Ordinary Time



The good news of today's Gospel is the extravagance of what is being given us. All we need do is be faithful in "small matters." St. Vincent often asked this simple question: "What would Jesus Christ do, if he were in my place now?"

Today is the Fourth World Day of the Poor. This year's theme "Stretch forth your hand to the poor" is a summons to responsibility and commitment as men and women who are part of our one human family. St. Vincent's question is especially apt now as we see the poor and disenfranchised here and abroad faced with greater problems and fewer answers. Around the world, and especially here at home, the poor find their safety nets weakened, homeless people crowd our cities, and refugees are turned away. As individuals, we can do little to address our nation's problems or our world's problems, but we can address those problems locally. Joining the Society of St. Vincent de Paul is one way to begin making a difference. Vincentians grow spiritually and develop Christian friendships while serving those in need. Through person-to-person service to those in need of housing, utilities, medications, food, and other necessities, Vincentians address local issues, helping people move out of poverty to self-sufficiency. MORE RANDOM THOUGHTS AND PRAYERS FROM DEACON SAM

--Can we accept God's answers to our prayers even if we don't get what we want? Trust based on conditions will only make us feel discouraged. Sometimes we want things so badly that we don't allow ourselves to be happy if we don't get them. It is fine to ask God for what we want but we should trust God enough to leave things in His hands. "God's will be done." Unconditional trust says "You are God and I am not. If I don't get what I want, I will still have an attitude of faith, I will still thank God."

--Sometimes the challenge of helping others wears us out. But, Jesus encourages us to do more, to work with each other, to help those in need. We humans crave relationships—we can root for each other by our words and action. During these particularly difficult times, may we keep each other in our prayers. The lesson we learn from the Gospels is to sit down with Jesus and listen to His word. May we have ears to hear what Jesus wants from us and hearts that love. And, may we continue to grow in our love of God and of one another.

--The change of lifestyle for many of us during this pandemic has given many of us a chance to do some extra learning. Learning should be a way of life for each of us regardless of our age. It has been said that the wealthiest places in the world are cemeteries—people often go to their graves with their greatest treasures and potential in them. God put skills and talents in each of us which we can develop. Try turning off the TV for 15 minutes each day and do something to improve your skills—don't settle for where you are and coast with what you have. Listen to educational tapes and pod-casts. Search out people on the internet who inspire you, people who can teach us because they have learned from their mistakes. See time as a gift—we have 86,400 seconds of life each day. Will Rogers once said: "Even if you are on the right track, if you just sit there you will be run over." We have more inside of us which we can develop with focus, discipline and self-control. These are tools which God gives us which will help us to do His will on earth and which will give Him praise.

--Praise is faith at work—it is an attitude of life. Sometimes our prayer time is a complaining session. I think that in tough times like these which we are presently experiencing, we need to turn up our praise of God. Start the day with praise, thanking God with enthusiasm for His many gifts to us: the sunrise, birds singing, God's greatness, our life and the presence of God in it, etc. God is always bigger than our problems. God hears us when we whisper. Keep a song of praise in your heart. Keep the words of this wonderful hymn near at hand and pray it often:

"Praise God from whom all blessings flow, Praise Him all creatures here below;
Praise Him above, ye heav'n-ly host, Praise Father, Son and Holy Ghost.
From all that dwell below the skies. Let the creator's praise arise!
Let the Redeemer's name be sung, Through every land by every one.
Eternal are thy mercies, Lord, and truth eternal is thy word;
Thy praise should sound from shore-to shore. Till suns shall rise and sit no more."

CAMBIA NUESTRAS VIDAS

Las cartas de Pablo a los tesalonicenses están entre sus primeros escritos movidos por su creencia, y la creencia de la comunidad de la Iglesia joven, de que el retorno de Cristo era inminente, y que dedicar tiempo y atención a otras cosas era tontería.

Con el paso del tiempo este fervor disminuyó un poco. Hoy, cuando escuchamos sobre la llegada del fin de los tiempos, podemos preguntarnos si la tenemos que tomar en serio, si es que realmente creemos que Cristo todavía puede venir por nosotros como “un ladrón en la noche” (1 Tesalonicenses 5:2). ¿Significa esto que debemos ponerle un paro a establecer metas a largo plazo, despojarnos de nuestros calendarios y agendas anuales, dejar de ahorrar para una educación universitaria? Por supuesto que no. Lo que significa es que necesitamos cambiar nuestra vida, vivir como hijos de la luz e ir iluminando el mundo que nos rodea con la luz del Evangelio. Entonces, en aquél día, cuando los detalles de nuestra vida diaria se tornen poco importantes, estaremos listos para encontrar nuestra paz y seguridad en Cristo Jesús.

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SAN ALBERTO MAGNO (1206-1280)

15 de noviembre

El primer amor de Alberto fueron las ciencias, pues mediante ellas descubrió y defendió la grandeza de Dios. Aunque amó las ciencias, más amó la teología. A los 16 años se trasladó a la Universidad de Padua, donde conoció a los dominicos, congregación a la cual se uniría para servir como maestro en Alemania a los 22 años y a los 23 vestir el hábito dominico, pese a la negativa de su padre. Su influencia en el pensamiento cristiano se dio gracias a que inició el diálogo de la fe con las ciencias. Entre sus discípulos tuvo al teólogo de todos los tiempos, Tomás de Aquino, quien sentaría las bases para la teología perenne. A los 48 años fue nombrado Provincial de Alemania, pero renunció para seguir enseñando y estudiando. Después, fue consagrado obispo de Ratisbona, cargo que ejerció durante dos años como un pastor caminante, sencillo y pobre. Fue un gran maestro al que se le dio el título de Magno debido a la amplitud, calidad y profundidad de sus escritos y pensamiento teológico.
