LITURGICAL TIDBIT

The Oil of the Infirm, the Oil of the Catechumen, and the Sacred Chrism

On our previous liturgical tidbit, we spoke about olive oil and how rich it is in symbolism within our tradition. At the back of our church, you may have noticed the *ambry*, the cabinet where we keep the three Holy Oils. The first of the oils is the **"OI"**, which stands for *Oleum Infirmorum*, the Oil of the Infirm. The Oil of the Infirm is used in the celebration of the Anointing of the Sick. We continue the practice of using oil as a symbol of God's healing; for the healing of body, mind, and soul. In the letter of St. James, he wrote: "Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven." The second of the oils is the **"OS"**, which stands for *Oleum Sanctorum*, the Oil of the Catechumens. In some vials, it is labeled as **"OC"** *Oleum Catechumenorum*. This oil is used for the anointing of those preparing for Baptism. Through the anointing of this oil, we prepare those who will receive baptism so that they are strengthened by Christ to resist the power of Satan and reject evil in all its forms. Finally, the last of the oils is the **"SC"**, which stands for *Sacrum Chrisma*, the Sacred Chrism. The oil is mixed with balsam or perfume to signify its uniqueness. This oil is different from that of the other oils. During the Chrism Mass, the bishop breathes over the vessel of chrism, a gesture which symbolizes the Holy Spirit coming down to consecrate this oil, because this oil is used for sacraments that have a life-giving and sanctifying nature. It is used to anoint infants after Baptism, those who are to be confirmed, for bishops and priests at their ordination, and altars and churches at the time of their dedication.

Environmental Justice

Lighthouse CD Kiosk

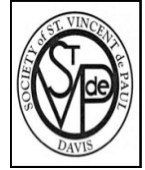

AND, YOU, WHO DO YOU SAY I AM?

Do we hear Jesus asking this question as we sit before Him in Adoration? Are we listening to Him? Do we come to listen? Are we willing to lay down our lives if He asks us? Besides the importance of listening to Him, our communication with Him can be ever more complete, too, if we lay our fears, problems, sorrows and sins before Him, as well as list all the blessings for which we are thankful. If we come to him in despair, we can look for hope. If we feel surrounded by darkness, we can seek His light. If we truly sit in trust and love before him we can look for intimacy with Him.

You come to Adoration, the sacred place of God's presence, to meet Jesus and speak to him face to face, heart to heart. With your whole mind, body and soul you seek His affection, remembering that He became flesh for you so that you would encounter him in the flesh and receive his love in the flesh. Jesus came to create in you a space where you can be with him, for He wants you to live the freedom of the children of God. Also remember Jesus' words for us: "Do not be afraid."

Make it a habit to spend time each week in Adoration. Through this intimate experience with our Lord you will bear witness to the Word of life in all that you do. Come in silence and trust; for He is expecting you. Eventually you will be able to answer His question. Try!!
