

The Vincentian Corner

January 20, 2019-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time:

In the Gospel today, at the wedding feast in Cana, Jesus reveals himself to his disciples and they began to believe in him. Every day, God also gives us signs of his love and so we also can respond in faith and trust.



We are now entering the fourth week of Poverty Awareness Month. Poverty is not a "catch phrase." Though we are often confronted with evidence of poverty on the streets of our city, how much do we really know about poverty. The most recent national statistics tell us that 16.3% of women and 13.8% of men make less than the government's official "poverty threshold" (approximately \$24,000 per year for a family of four). 21.2% of children and 14.5% of seniors live in poverty. As Jesus revealed himself to those feasting at Cana, so he reveals himself to us through those poor we see on our streets and those we do not see who barely scrape by on minimum wage jobs. Each week St. James Vincentians reach out to those in financial difficulty, the visible and invisible poor, encountering, as Mother Teresa put it, Jesus in the distressing disguise of the poor.

THE IMPORTANCE OF ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Do YOU want to transform our Church?

How? First of all realize that you are part of the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ Who is the Church. So, how can you take part in transforming our Church? Aside from receiving Jesus in the Eucharist on Sundays, one of the easiest ways to grow closer to our Lord is to attend Eucharistic Adoration. Sitting in Adoration in silence and prayer can be heart-changing, comforting, refreshing, life changing, and an opportunity for increase in faith and hope. It is a grace to realize that Jesus is present in the Blessed Sacrament waiting for you in love and in silence while you pour out your heart to him. Even if words fail you during your time with him you can still adore him by just your presence. He knows you. No need to explain yourself.

In the words of Bishop James Conley of Lincoln, Nebraska: "Kneeling before Christ in the Eucharist, the hopeless find hope. The weak find strength. Captives find freedom. The afflicted find comfort. The mourning find consolation. The lowly find friendship. Sinners find mercy." Love pours into us. We may go to our families, friends and the world where we in turn pour out love. For families to come to Adoration together would be a wealth of blessing for them to share with others. Let us pray: O Jesus, our Lord and our God, creator and ruler of the vast universe, we lovingly adore you hidden so humbly. We rejoice that the Blessed Sacrament is not merely a Holy thing, but a living person – the same Christ who died for us on Calvary, but who loved us so much that he wanted to remain with us forever. Eucharistic Adoration at St. James is every Monday 7:30am-5pm, and Thursdays 6-9pm. Please join us!!

Liturgical Tidbit

The Mass as a Privileged Encounter with Jesus Christ

Recently, we have just explored one of the basic dimensions of the mass as a *sacrifice*, but now let us talk about the mass as an encounter with Jesus. The mass is described by our Vatican II fathers as the “source and summit of the Christian life.” But what does that really mean? To put it in the simplest way, it means that within the mass is *the privileged encounter with Jesus Christ*. We need to always be aware that Christianity is not simply an ideology, a philosophy, or a social justice group. Christianity is rather a relationship. It is a *friendship* with the Risen Christ. The Church’s teachings, the sacraments, the moral life, the virtues, etc. ultimately all relates to and comes back to that friendship with Christ. The mass is where we encounter Jesus in a most intimate way to get to know him, and so as we get to know him, just as any kind of friendship, we also get to know the demands of that friendship.

Environmental Justice

"Greater scarcity of water will lead to an increase in the cost of food and the various products which depend on its use. Some studies warn that an acute water shortage may occur within a few decades unless urgent action is taken." Laudato Si, #31

As we continue to suffer from the effects of drought and flooding, remember that in particularly arid countries, lack of water for crops is already causing migrations of people. What can we do to work for just water policies both here and among the poorer countries?

Flu Season and the Suspension of the Cup and other precautions

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has reported that the incidence of flu and flu-like illnesses is widespread and has reached a level requiring that we enact preventive measures to mitigate the possibility of infection at Mass. In order to protect the health and well being of everyone, Bishop Soto has issued the following directives:

- The use of the Communion cup is suspended temporarily.
- Receive the Body of Christ in the hand (although receiving on the tongue is permitted).
- Do not shake hands. Offer the sign of Peace to those around you with a simple nod, say “peace be with you.”
- Do not hold hands during the Our Father.
- Extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are reminded to cleanse their hands with an alcohol-based antiseptic before and after administering Holy Communion. This also applies to those who take Holy Communion to the home-bound.

The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and other Holy Days does not apply to those who are sick. If you are sick, stay home and take care of yourself. Thank you for your patience and understanding during this time. And pray for those who are sick. The administration of Holy Communion in both kinds will resume as soon as the Bishop deems it safe and prudent to do so.

Timoteo es descrito por Pablo como un "hombre de Dios" a quien le pide que no se abochorne de ser joven y que no permita que alguien lo desprecie por ser un líder joven. Asimismo, fue su compañero apostólico en la evangelización de Tesalónica, Corinto y Éfeso. De esta última comunidad fue su obispo y ahí tuvo como encargo organizar la comunidad y sus ministerios. Fue testigo del martirio de Pablo y, posteriormente, él mismo sufrió el martirio. Tito fue convertido al cristianismo por el mismo Pablo. Es Pablo quien destaca en Tito las cualidades de artífice de la paz, administrador, mediador en los conflictos y de gran capacidad para organizar las comunidades nacientes que enfrentaban el acecho de la falsa doctrina. Tito murió, según las fuentes a los 93 años. Pablo escribe a ambos, en sus cartas pastorales, respecto a las cualidades que ellos, como obispos, deben tener. Asimismo, recorre uno a uno los ministerios de la Iglesia y los comportamientos que deben ser observados por los miembros de la comunidad.

Una vez ordenado diácono se distinguió por la predicación elocuente y la defensa de la fe. Fue arrestado mientras visitaba a su obispo, preso a causa de la persecución impulsada por el emperador Daciano quien, al saber que visitó a su obispo mandó que lo apresaran, haciéndolo caminar desde Zaragoza hasta Valencia. Una vez preso se le sometió a la tortura, no obstante, la tortura no lograba nada y el emperador, lleno de ira, mandó que golpearan a los torturadores. Posteriormente le hizo encerrar en una celda oscura, llena de tientos filosos para que se cortara sus pies, pero no renunció a su fe cristiana, convirtió al carcelero y cantó himnos de alabanza.
