NEW MASS TIMES, PROCEDURES STARTING 11/22/2020

Due to the recent tier change in our area due to the pandemic, we must adapt our masses for safety, to be in compliance with state guidelines, and with the Bishop's directives.

We will begin offering Communion to Parishioner's vehicles at the appropriate time during the Mass. Because it is dark, we must cancel the 5:30 pm Mass on Saturdays until further notice.

We are live-streaming the following Masses on our YouTube channel; 8:00 am, 10:00 am, and 12:00 pm on Sundays in addition to the daily Masses; 7:00 am Monday through Friday and 8:00 am on Saturday.

For those who wish to receive Communion, our Presider and EMs will come to your car. Parishioners are asked to stay in their vehicles. They are asked to turn on their hazard lights, and to keep them on until they receive communion. Communion will be distributed during the Mass at the appropriate time.

Bishop Soto has granted a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday for those members of the Faithful who are sixty years of age and older as well as those suffering vulnerable health conditions. Due to new instructions provided by State and local public health officials, this decree is now extended to include all members of the Catholic Faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. This dispensation will continue until further notice.

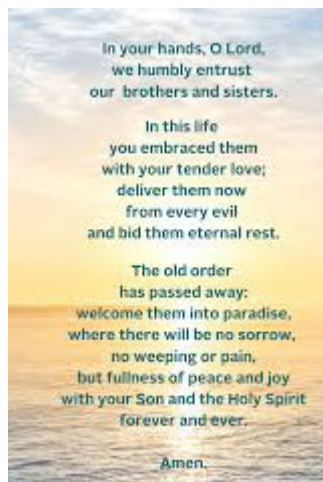

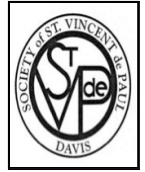

The Vincentian Corner November 22, 2020 Christ the King



Today as we celebrate the feast of Christ the King, may we open the doors of our hearts so wide that we may listen to the voice of Jesus calling us to help build his kingdom here on earth. As Jesus says in today's Gospel, "...whatever you did for one of the least brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

Father Richard McCullen, Superior General of the Congregation of the Mission and of the Daughters of Charity (Vincentian priests and sisters) writes, "As you serve Christ your King, be an open door that is fully open to others, especially the poor. . .

Open the door of your heart widely to those who claim a little more understanding from you. Open the door of your heart so widely that you can belong to the truth and listen to the voice of Jesus." Devotion to Christ the King means loving those people whom, when he was a king on earth, Jesus liked to have close to him – the hungry, the homeless, the refugee – and yet in our world – even in our own community – we hear people vilify the homeless man on the corner and shut out the asylum-seeker at the border. Mary and Joseph fled King Herod to seek refuge in another country. Would you open the door to Jesus and his family or slam it in their faces?

MORE RANDOM THOUGHTS AND PRAYERS FROM DEACON SAM

--Can we accept God's answers to our prayers even if we don't get what we want? Trust based on conditions will only make us feel discouraged. Sometimes we want things so badly that we don't allow ourselves to be happy if we don't get them. It is fine to ask God for what we want but we should trust God enough to leave things in His hands. "God's will be done." Unconditional trust says "You are God and I am not. If I don't get what I want, I will still have an attitude of faith, I will still thank God."

--Sometimes the challenge of helping others wears us out. But, Jesus encourages us to do more, to work with each other, to help those in need. We humans crave relationships—we can root for each other by our words and action. During these particularly difficult times, may we keep each other in our prayers. The lesson we learn from the Gospels is to sit down with Jesus and listen to His word. May we have ears to hear what Jesus wants from us and hearts that love. And, may we continue to grow in our love of God and of one another.

--The change of lifestyle for many of us during this pandemic has given many of us a chance to do some extra learning. Learning should be a way of life for each of us regardless of our age. It has been said that the wealthiest places in the world are cemeteries—people often go to their graves with their greatest treasures and potential in them. God put skills and talents in each of us which we can develop. Try turning off the TV for 15 minutes each day and do something to improve your skills—don't settle for where you are and coast with what you have. Listen to educational tapes and pod-casts. Search out people on the internet who inspire you, people who can teach us because they have learned from their mistakes. See time as a gift—we have 86,400 seconds of life each day. Will Rogers once said: "Even if you are on the right track, if you just sit there you will be run over." We have more inside of us which we can develop with focus, discipline and self-control. These are tools which God gives us which will help us to do His will on earth and which will give Him praise.

--Praise is faith at work—it is an attitude of life. Sometimes our prayer time is a complaining session. I think that in tough times like these which we are presently experiencing, we need to turn up our praise of God. Start the day with praise, thanking God with enthusiasm for His many gifts to us: the sunrise, birds singing, God's greatness, our life and the presence of God in it, etc. God is always bigger than our problems. God hears us when we whisper. Keep a song of praise in your heart. Keep the words of this wonderful hymn near at hand and pray it often:

"Praise God from whom all blessings flow, Praise Him all creatures here below;
Praise Him above, ye heav'n-ly host, Praise Father, Son and Holy Ghost.
From all that dwell below the skies. Let the creator's praise arise!
Let the Redeemer's name be sung, Through every land by every one.
Eternal are thy mercies, Lord, and truth eternal is thy word;
Thy praise should sound from shore-to shore. Till suns shall rise and sit no more."

"I believe in angels, something good in all I see."

Angels protect, guard and give us the message that God loves us. Even a secular song can give us an "oomph" to carry on!

SANTA CECILIA (Siglo II)

22 de noviembre

Santa Cecilia es la patrona de los músicos, pero antes de cantar, su vida toda fue un canto para Dios. Nació en Roma y desde muy joven prometió entregarse a Dios y permanecer casta. Su padre no pensó así y la obligó a casarse con un no cristiano llamado Valeriano, quien no sólo respetó su voluntad, sino que también se hizo cristiano. Fue él mismo quien convirtió a su hermano Tiburcio, para luego, ser martirizados ante su negativa de adorar a los dioses de Roma. Al ver la manera heroica en que morían, Máximo, un cortesano se convirtió al cristianismo y también lo martirizaron. Cecilia dio sepultura cristiana a los tres, acción que le valió la reprensión y el juicio frente al Prefecto Almaquio, quien al ver que no desistía de su fe mandó que la quemaran en el baño de su casa, pero el fuego no le hizo nada. Después, mandó que la decapitaran y luego de golpearla en el cuello, agonizó durante tres días hasta que entregó su espíritu. Fue sepultada en las catacumbas de san Calixto.
