The Vincentian Corner

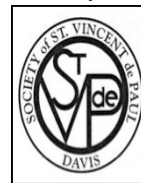
February 10, 2019-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time:

In the Gospel today, the disciples decide to leave everything to follow their Master.

We are also called to follow Jesus, who tells

us that "whatever you do to the least of mine, you do unto me."

When Jesus called us to serve those in need, he did not say, "It would be nice if you fed the hungry, clothed the naked, sheltered the homeless." Reaching out to the least of Jesus' sisters and brothers is not an option; it is a core value of our faith. This preferential option for the poor is at the heart of Catholic Christianity and the center of Vincentian spirituality. Who **are** the poor who reach out to St. James Vincentians for help? They are the homeless and hungry. They are the disabled and unemployed. They are the sick (and often elderly) unable to pay for medical help. They are the "invisible poor," struggling to keep a roof over their heads and the utilities operating. They are single women with children whose fathers no longer care for them. They are immigrants struggling to make a living in their new home. The poor are all around us, and whenever you support our conference, you are doing something for the "least" of Jesus.



THE IMPORTANCE OF ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Do YOU want to transform our Church? How? First of all realize that you are part of the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ Who is the Church. So, how can you take part in transforming our Church? Aside from receiving Jesus in the Eucharist on Sundays, one of the easiest ways to grow closer to our Lord is to attend Eucharistic Adoration. Sitting in Adoration in silence and prayer can be heart-changing, comforting, refreshing, life changing, and an opportunity for increase in faith and hope. It is a grace to realize that Jesus is present in the Blessed Sacrament waiting for you in love and in silence while you pour out your heart to him. Even if words fail you during your time with him you can still adore him by just your presence. He knows you. No need to explain yourself. For us Jesus had sacrificed his life on the cross for our salvation. His sacrifice was his gift of love. Now we are presented with the choice to show our love to him by offering some of our time out of our busy lives. "When my people humble themselves and seek my presence...I will revive their land." (2Chr. 7-14)

Your commitment to Adoration will be the best and easiest investment you will ever make! Each effort you make to adore our Lord will leave your soul everlastingly more glorious and beautiful in heaven!! "They who humble themselves shall be exalted..." "All of us, gazing on the Lord's glory with unveiled faces, are being transformed from glory to glory into his very image." (Lk. 18:14; 2Cor. 3_18)

In the words of Bishop James Conley of Lincoln, Nebraska: "Kneeling before Christ in the Eucharist, the hopeless find hope. The weak find strength. Captives find freedom. The afflicted find comfort. The mourning find consolation. The lowly find friendship. Sinners find mercy." Love pours into us. We may go to our families, friends and the world where we in turn pour out love. For families to come to Adoration together would be a wealth of blessing for them to share with others. Let us pray: O Jesus, our Lord and our God, creator and ruler of the vast universe, we lovingly adore you hidden so humbly. We rejoice that the Blessed Sacrament is not merely a Holy thing, but a living person – the same Christ who died for us on Calvary, but who loved us so much that he wanted to remain with us forever. Eucharistic Adoration at St. James is every Monday 7:30am-5pm, and Thursdays 6-9pm. Please join us!!

Liturgical Tidbit

Receiving the Eucharist

In our past discussions in our Liturgical Tidbits, we have briefly explored the mass as a *sacrifice*, a *privileged encounter with Christ*, and as a *meal*. Although these are short discourses, I hope that we've learned and have come to appreciate more what the mass is. If we've noticed, everything in our discussion has been *Christ-centered*. In mass, the one being sacrificed is Christ, the one who we're encountering is Christ, and the host of the meal is also Christ.

Now let us focus on a more specific part of the mass: receiving the Eucharist during *communion time*. This is the time when Christ himself offers his body and blood to us so that we can share in his divine life. As Catholics, one of the greatest mysteries we believe that our Lord passed down to us is that the substance of the bread and wine truly does change into his body and blood. And so as we receive our Lord into our own bodies, it is very important that we treat him with utmost respect. As a great sign of respect, we should try to avoid assuming a "taking" position, rather we should be in a "receiving" position as we partake of this one body. The Church suggests that we receive our Lord either from the tongue or with our palms being offered (left over right hand or vice versa). I hope that we can keep in mind that we do not "take" from our Lord, but rather "receive" from him. ~Fr. Joshua Sia

Environmental Justice

"From panoramic vistas to the tiniest living form, nature is a constant source of wonder and awe. It is also a continuing revelation of the divine." You Love All that Exists, Canadian Conference of Bishops (Laudato Si, #85)

Catholics are taught of the Revelation of God through scripture, and certainly of the Revelation of God in Jesus. We may be less familiar with the concept of Revelation through nature and God's Creation. Take time to study a majestic mountain, a giant redwood, or a delicate flower. What might you discover about God?

Flu Season and the Suspension of the Cup and other precautions

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has reported that the incidence of flu and flu-like illnesses is widespread and has reached a level requiring that we enact preventive measures to mitigate the possibility of infection at Mass. In order to protect the health and well being of everyone, Bishop Soto has issued the following directives:

- The use of the Communion cup is suspended temporarily.
- Receive the Body of Christ in the hand (although receiving on the tongue is permitted).
- Do not shake hands. Offer the sign of Peace to those around you with a simple nod, say "peace be with you."
- Do not hold hands during the Our Father.
- Extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are reminded to cleanse their hands with an alcohol-based antiseptic before and after administering Holy Communion. This also applies to those who take Holy Communion to the home-bound.

The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and other Holy Days does not apply to those who are sick. If you are sick, stay home and take care of yourself. And pray for those who are sick. The administration of Holy Communion in both species will resume as soon as the Bishop deems it safe and prudent to do so.

St. James School is blessed to have a magnificent music program under the direction of Mike Schwagerus, known as Mr. S to our students. Starting in Transitional Kindergarten, our students attend weekly music classes to learn songs for mass and special celebrations along with music theory and appreciation. In 3rd grade, our students receive a recorder and begin to read music. In 4th grade, all students select an instrument to play as part of the Beginning Band. Starting in 5th grade, St. James students are eligible for Concert Band and Rhythm Section. Our bands often play in conjunction with the St. James Choir for special performances. As students enter the 4th grade, they are able to join the St. James School Choir. In the spring of 2014, 2016, and 2018, our Choir were invited to perform at Disneyland.

The St. James School Choir attended the twenty-first annual Diocesan Choral Festival on February 4th. Our students joined 13 Diocesan schools for the festival held at Christian Brothers High School. Our choir beautifully performed "Do You Know Your Shepard's Voice." It was absolutely breathtaking!

SANTA ESCOLÁSTICA
(c. 480-543)

10 de febrero

Lo que sabemos de santa Escolástica lo hemos conocido gracias a los escritos de Benito, su hermano gemelo y gran reformador de la vida monástica, fundador del convento de Monte Cassino. Siguiendo el ejemplo de su hermano, Escolástica fundó el monasterio para mujeres en Plombariola. Puesto que en ambas comunidades estaba prohibida la entrada a personas del sexo opuesto, Benito y Escolástica se reunían una vez por año en un punto intermedio para orar y hablar de la vida espiritual. Según las fuentes, durante su último encuentro llegó la hora de despedirse, Benito tenía que regresar al convento. Su hermana le insistió en que se quedara, pero se negó. Entonces, Escolástica le imploró a Dios que su hermano permaneciera y la respuesta fue una tormenta copiosa, de tal suerte que irse era algo impensable. Benedicto reconoció en esta acción no sólo la voluntad de Dios sino la petición que su hermana le había hecho al mismo Dios que tanto amaban. Tres días después Escolástica fue llamada a la patria eterna. Escolástica valoró las cosas pequeñas y la confianza en Dios.

- Los ministros de la Eucaristía deben limpiarse las manos con un antiséptico a base de alcohol antes y después de administrar la Sagrada Comunión a los que visitan en sus casas.

La asistencia a Misa los domingos y días festivos no es obligatoria para los enfermos. Si estás enfermo, quédate en casa y cuídate.

Gracia por su paciencia y comprensión durante esta temporada. Ruega por los enfermos. La Sagrada Comunión por los dos medios retornará cuando el Señor Obispo lo juzgue prudente.
