The Vincentian Corner

August 11, 2019—Nineteenth Sunday
in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel

Jesus tells his disciples, “See your belongings and give alms. Provide money

bags for yourselves that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can reach nor moth destroy. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be”

Our “treasure” is something very valuable or our most prized possession, but in this gospel, we find Jesus using the word to mean something much different and much better. This gospel refers to “treasure” as inexhaustible, secure and incorruptible. This description is of the “treasure” understood as the kingdom of God. Interestingly, the way to possess this treasure is not by possessing, but by giving away. We become rich, by not having and then refocusing our hearts on God’s kingdom. If we are preoccupied by possessions, schedules, work, sports, etc., rather than the needs of our poorer brothers and sister, our hearts are already filled with exhaustible, insecure, and corruptible matters. The challenge of this gospel is to redirect our hearts to what is our true treasure – Jesus – and then be faithful disciples, taking his gift – his “treasure” – to others, especially those in who turn to us for our help and our love.

VISITING MISSIONARY NEXT WEEKEND

The Missionary Cooperative Appeal is an annual program in which missionaries from around the world speak at each parish. The goal of this appeal is to increase awareness of missionary work and to raise funds to help missionary organizations continue their evangelization efforts. In the Diocese of Sacramento, 50 different missions were selected this year to each speak at two parishes. Last year through generous denotations, we collected \$420,110 for 50 missions. ABIDE IN ME, AS I ABIDE IN YOU

Our Eucharistic Lord wants to abide with us. How can we turn down such an invitation? Recall Jesus' words: "If you are thirsty, come to me." From this fountain of love in the Blessed Sacrament He pours out all the merits of His sufferings upon the world. And we all are called to drink deeply from it. Let us trust in His love to ask for His powerful graces. Let us approach Him with bold confidence. May we ever be reminded that we draw great nourishment from times of adoration.

When you are in His presence you don't have to do anything, or have to say particular prayers, or read or anything else. All you have to do is be present to the One who is present to you. Certainly, bodily presence is a first step, but also we need to try to be present with our hearts. So that means to have a loving awareness of who is present. Be still and know that I am God. Psalm 46. Even in a short time in silent presence to the Lord is a precious treasure, for it is in this silence that the Lord can speak to us. So in silent adoration before our Lord we are irradiated by His Eucharistic presence.

There is no single way to approach Our Lord in Adoration. Jesus knows who you are and what is going on in your life. Be confident that He has called you to this time of Adoration, so in trust lay your life before him and go from there. Take this opportunity to thank Him for the many blessings in your life, ask for help when you need guidance, or discernment. Above all, rest in His Presence—God loves you!



Clark Edward Goecker
March 15, 1944 ~ July 25, 2019

Clark Goecker, age 75, died peacefully at home from complications of multiple myeloma, a blood cancer. He was born in San Francisco to Bruce and Jeanne (Pacheco) and was raised in Marin County, CA. Clark attended Redwood High School and University of San Francisco. His lifelong career of 34 years was with the League of California Cities, in Sacramento. He and his wife of 43 years, Janet Gift, made their home in Davis, CA for almost 4 decades.

In 2000, Clark was ordained as a deacon in the Catholic Church. In addition to preaching and presiding over weddings and funerals at St. James. He served for 10 years as director of the Newman Center in Davis, a Catholic community for UC Davis students. In 2014, he and his wife moved to Washington state to be near family and he served briefly in the Archdiocese of Seattle. Clark loved serving the Church and spending time with family at vacation homes at Sea Ranch, CA and Whidbey Island, WA.

Clark was a loving husband to his wife, Janet, and father to son Seth (partner Erin) and daughter Erin (Wes). Another daughter, Tara, predeceased him in 1991. He enjoyed his role as Papa to his grandchildren, Miles and Rowan Buckwalter. He will be missed by his sisters, Terry Lind (Steve) of Olympia, WA and Laura Francis (Vern) of Dallas, TX, as well as his nieces and nephews and many other friends and family members.

En fin, el Hogar de Cristo se dedica a difundir la realidad de los pobres por medio de nuestro llamado bautismal a la responsabilidad que tenemos en darle al Hijo de hombre un lugar para reclinar su cabeza.
