2019 LENTEN REGULATIONS

Lent is a season in which the faithful are called to reflect on the Paschal Mystery in a particularly focused way. It is a time of spiritual renewal and to carefully examine one's relationship with God and others. It is also a time in which catechumens prepare to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. The Church calls everyone, therefore, to a spirit of penance through the traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE.

-All persons, 14 years and older, are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Other forms of abstinence, including abstinence from alcoholic beverages, television, video games, the internet and social media during and other electronic devices Lent is spiritually beneficial.

-Everyone from ages 18 to 59 is obliged to **fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent, especially on Wednesdays and Fridays, is highly recommended. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, neither the law of fasting nor the law of abstinence obliges. If in doubt, one's parish priest or confessor should be consulted.

PRAYER

-Catholics are urged to read and pray with sacred Scripture more intently during Lent. The faithful are encouraged to participate in special devotions offered by the parish, especially parish penance services and Eucharistic adoration. Other devotions such as the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, visits to the Blessed Sacrament, and praying for vocations to the priesthood and religious life are also encouraged.

-The Stations of the Cross are to be celebrated in each parish on Fridays during Lent and everyone is encouraged to attend.

ALMSGIVING

-All Catholics are urged to give generously to assist the poor and support the charitable works of the Church, especially through their local parish and the Annual Catholic Appeal.

-The faithful are also encouraged to visit the sick, the homebound, the aged, and those in prison, remembering the words of our Lord Jesus Christ who said, "As you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me." (Matthew 25:40). Fasting and abstinence together with almsgiving and charitable works unites us to the crucified Christ reflected in the image of our brothers and sisters who suffer.

Liturgical Tidbit

The Lenten Practices

The three basic practices that we usually do during Lent take the form of *fasting*, *prayer*, and *almsgiving*. These Lenten Practices derive from Jesus' own denial of the devil during his own forty days in the desert. If we haven't noticed, Lent always commences with the temptations of Jesus in the desert. The devil always has one main mission in the Bible, and that is to move us to another path that leads away from God and to order our desires to something less than God. When the devil confronted Jesus, the evil one gives him three basic temptations: to make stone into bread, to challenge the glory and honor of God, and finally to test God's power. All of which boils down to our own desires of sensual pleasure, thirst for glory, and hunger for power. These things in themselves are good, but once we make these things our central preoccupation and put God aside, then we know the evil one is succeeding in our lives. This is why during Lent, we are given the opportunity to again reexamine our relationship with these three basic desires. We go through *fasting* so that we may realize that "*one does not live on bread alone*", we intensify our *prayer* so that we may give glory to God instead of ourselves, and finally we do *almsgiving* so that we may teach ourselves to let go of the things we have power over.

Blessing of Easter Baskets

An old tradition in many European countries is the Blessing of an Easter Basket filled with special foods to be shared and eaten at the Easter Sunday morning meal. Foods that would be included; Hard boiled eggs, butter, cheese, homemade bread, chocolates, sweet cakes, jam, salt, pepper, beets, horseradish, ham, kielbasa, etc. are blessed.

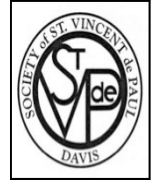
School — Parish Connection

The Vincentian Corner

April 7, 2019-Fifth Sunday of Lent:

In today's Gospel, Jesus is the model of compassion and kindness. He shows us how to be merciful and nonjudgmental.



When we give to the poor, God indeed pours his love, peace and mercy into our hearts and into the hearts of those suffering in poverty. Because of the generosity of our fellow parishioners, St. James Vincentians were able to help a number of our needy neighbors in the first quarter of this year. During that period, our members made 29 visits (including four to homeless individuals in need). As a result of those visits, SVdeP provided \$11,300 in aid, mostly for rent and utilities, avoiding evictions and utility cutoffs. Home visitors also provided bags of food and paper goods. The conference also made valuable referrals to other aid agencies such as food banks, shelters, homeless assistance, housing providers, legal advice, and medical help. 62 people were helped, including 21 minors. Six were homeless adults. SVdeP volunteers drove 248 miles and spent 88 hours on these visits. Thank you for your continuing generosity.

Environmental Justice

"Each year sees the disappearance of thousands of plant and animal species which we will never know, which our children will never see because they have been lost forever. The great majority become extinct for reasons related to human activity. Because of us, thousands of species will no longer give glory to a God by their very existence, nor convey their message to us. We have no such right." (Laudato Si, #33)

Lent is a time for reflecting and turning away from all that is not consistent with God's call to us. Humanity seems to be at the beginning of another massive extinction cycle, endangering many species before we fully understand our interdependence with them. By doing so, we endanger our own existence. Take some time to reflect on how our society can best cherish the natural gifts of the Creator.

TEMPORADA DE FLU

Precauciones para evitar el contagio.

El Departamento de Salud Publica de California ha reportado que la incidencia del Flu y enfermedades similares ha llegado a un extremo en que se deben aplicar medidas para evitar contagios durante la Misa.

Para proteger la salud y bienestar de todos, el Obispo Soto ha emitido los siguientes mandatos:

- El uso del Cáliz de la Comunión se suspende temporalmente.
- Recibir el Cuerpo de Cristo en la mano. (aunque recibirlo en la lengua esta permitido)
- No darse la mano. Ofrecer el signo de paz con una inclinación de la cabeza diciendo "la paz este contigo."
- No tomarse de la mano durante el Padrenuestro.
- Los ministros de la Eucaristía deben limpiarse las manos con un antiséptico a base de alcohol antes y después de administrar la Sagrada Comunión a los que visitan en sus casas.

La asistencia a Misa los domingos y días festivos no es obligatoria para los enfermos. Si estás enfermo, quédate en casa y cuídate.

Gracia por su paciencia y comprensión durante esta temporada. Rueda por los enfermos. La Sagrada Comunión por los dos medios retornará cuando el Señor Obispo lo juzgue prudente.

**TRADICIONES DE
NUESTRA FE**

Artesanos preparan alfombras de flores y plumas de Quetzal en Guatemala para las fiestas de esta semana santa.

Grupos de fieles practican su papel de personaje judío o romano para los vía crucis en México, Texas, Chicago y tantos lugares más. Fraternidades penitenciales están preparándose espiritualmente para cargar con imágenes sagradas y pesadas por calles españolas.

Muchos más están preparando sus maletas para irse a la playa o las montañas donde, probablemente, nunca recordaran el nombre de Jesús.

Estos últimos se perderán las liturgias más significativas de nuestra fe cristiana; ritos llenos de movimiento desde afuera de la Iglesia hasta adentro. Están llenos de símbolos que nos llaman a la verdad de la existencia cristiana y humana: somos personas paradójicas. Comenzamos entre los hosannas del Domingo de Ramos, pasamos por las dolorosas imágenes del Viernes Santo y terminamos entre juegos de oscuridad, fuego y agua en la Vigilia Pascual.

Muchas veces honramos al Señor y tantas veces lo negamos, pero él nunca deja de llamarnos. En fin nos recuerda que la condición humana es sagrada y profana a la vez.

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REGLAMENTOS CUAESMALES DEL 2019

El 6 de marzo de 2019, Miércoles de Ceniza, emprendemos otra vez el recorrido cuaresmal durante el cual procuramos profundizar nuestra conversión. La cuaresma nos prepara para celebrar el Misterio Pascual de la pasión, muerte y resurrección de Cristo. Es tiempo de reflexión y renovación espiritual, tiempo de examinar nuestra relación con Dios y con los demás. También es un momento en el cual los catecúmenos se preparan para recibir el Sacramento de Iniciación en la Vigilia Pascual. La Iglesia también llama a los católicos a adoptar un espíritu de penitencia, especialmente la práctica de los "Actos Religiosos": el ayuno, la oración y la limosna.

AYUNO Y ABSTINENCIA

Abstinencia: Todas las personas que hayan cumplido los 14 años de edad tienen la obligación de **abstenerse de comer carne el miércoles de Ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma**. Otras formas de abstinencia durante la Cuaresma serían: abstenerse de bebidas alcohólicas, televisión, videojuegos, internet, redes sociales y otros dispositivos electrónicos. La Cuaresma es espiritualmente beneficiosa.

Ayuno: Todas las personas, de 18 años hasta los 59, tienen la obligación de **ayunar el miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo**. El ayuno es opcional en otros días de la cuaresma, especialmente los miércoles y viernes, es sumamente recomendable.

En casos en que peligre la salud o la capacidad de trabajo, no se aplican las leyes del ayuno y abstinencia. Si se tienen dudas al respecto, se ha de consultar con un sacerdote de la parroquia o con un confesor.

ORACIÓN

Con el fin de profundizar nuestro amor por Cristo, los católicos debemos orar y meditar las Sagradas Escrituras; participar en los actos piadosos que ofrezca nuestra parroquia; y orar con mayor fervor individualmente, en familia y en comunión con otras personas. A los fieles se les exhorta a que recen el rosario, visiten al Santísimo Sacramento y oren, especialmente por las vocaciones al sacerdocio y a la vida consagrada, y por la paz mundial.

LIMOSNA

Todos los católicos se les pide que ayuden generosamente a las obras caritativas de la Iglesia, incluyendo las contribuciones regulares a su parroquia y a la Campaña Católica Anual. Se les invita también a que ayuden de diferentes maneras a los enfermos, a los necesitados, a los ancianos y encarcelados.
