LITURGICAL TIDBIT

The Holy Oils

Once a year a Chrism Mass is held, (April 11 for our diocese) as part of the preparation for the high point in the liturgical life of the Church: Holy Week and Easter. Our priests in the diocese renew their priestly vows and the bishop also consecrates the Holy Oils to be used for the sacramental life of the Church for that year. The oil that we commonly use is olive oil. Why olive oil you may ask? Throughout Scriptures, various references indicate the importance of this oil in daily life. Oil was used in cooking, particularly in the making of bread. Oil is used as a basic food substance for nourishment, as a fuel for lamps, and as a healing agent in medicine. Moreover, with oil, the ancient Jews anointed the head of a guest as a sign of welcome, to beautify one's appearance, and prepared a body for burial. In religious practices, the Jews also used oil to offer sacrifices, to dedicate a memorial stone in honor of God. to consecrate a meeting tent, the ark of the covenant, the table, the lampstand, the laver, the altar of incense, the altar of holocausts, and it was also used in the anointing of a king-more significantly, King David. Therefore, the symbolism of oil in our tradition is very rich; sanctification, healing, strengthening, beautification, dedication, consecration, and sacrifice.

Memo from James Cavanagh, Director of Worship

Many have asked when the flu restrictions will be lifted. We base our decision on the influenza surveillance report issued by the California Department of Public Heath (CDPH) each Friday.

According to the latest report:

- Flu activity is decreasing but remains elevated and "widespread" in California.
- Several more weeks of flu activity are expected.
- The restrictions will be lifted when Influenza-like illnesses (ILIs) have dropped below the critical threshold of two standard deviations above baseline for two consecutive weeks.
- I expect the restrictions to remain in place for a few more weeks.

El primer día de mayo es reconocido como el día mundial del trabajo y conmemora seis mártires de Chicago, quienes fueron fusilados en 1886 cuando la policía trató de impedir una pelea campal durante una huelga de obreros.
