2019 LENTEN REGULATIONS

Lent this year begins on **March 6, Ash Wednesday**. Lent is a season in which the faithful are called to reflect on the Paschal Mystery in a particularly focused way. It is a time of spiritual renewal and to carefully examine one's relationship with God and others. It is also a time in which catechumens prepare to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. The Church calls everyone, therefore, to a spirit of penance through the traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

-All persons, 14 years and older, are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Other forms of abstinence, including abstinence from alcoholic beverages, television, video games, the internet and social media during and other electronic devices Lent is spiritually beneficial.

-Everyone from ages 18 to 59 is obliged to **fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent, especially on Wednesdays and Fridays, is highly recommended. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, neither the law of fasting nor the law of abstinence obliges. If in doubt, one's parish priest or confessor should be consulted.

PRAYER

-Catholics are urged to read and pray with sacred Scripture more intently during Lent. The faithful are encouraged to participate in special devotions offered by the parish, especially parish penance services and Eucharistic adoration. Other devotions such as the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, visits to the Blessed Sacrament, and praying for vocations to the priesthood and religious life are also encouraged.

-The Stations of the Cross are to be celebrated in each parish on Fridays during Lent and everyone is encouraged to attend.

ALMSGIVING

-All Catholics are urged to give generously to assist the poor and support the charitable works of the Church, especially through their local parish and the Annual Catholic Appeal.

-The faithful are also encouraged to visit the sick, the homebound, the aged, and those in prison, remembering the words of our Lord Jesus Christ who said, "As you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me." (Matthew 25:40). Fasting and abstinence together with almsgiving and charitable works unites us to the crucified Christ reflected in the image of our brothers and sisters who suffer.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION: OBLATION AND INTERCESSION

How fortunate we are in our parish that we have the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Every Monday from 7:30 a.m. to 5 the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for our adoration in the Chapel. Also Thursday evenings from 6 to 9 p.m. Jesus is present, waiting for adorers. Eventually more days will be available as the need for other days become apparent. Please let the office know if you can't come for Adoration on the two prescribed days. We will do our best to accommodate everyone.

Many holy people and saints have gone before us who made time to spend silent and prayerful times with Jesus. For example, St. Alphonsus Liguori from the 18th century was often rapt in ecstasy before the Blessed Sacrament. He made frequent visits. One of his simple but favorite prayers was: "O my God, my Love, O everlasting Love, I love Thee!" During his life he wrote many prayers for Adoration which were translated into numerous languages. He often said that next to Holy Communion that no act of worship is so pleasing to God and none so useful as the frequent visit to our Lord Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament dwelling upon our altars. All people are invited for worship – the young and the old. Some entire families have been seen in our chapel during Adoration. What an excellent example for the young!

If Jesus were actually visible in our church, everyone would run to welcome him, but he remains hidden in the Sacred Host under the appearance of bread, because he is calling us to faith, that many may come to him in humility. "The Blessed Sacrament is the "Living Heart" of each of our churches and it is our very sweet duty to honor and adore the Blessed Host, which our eyes see, -the Incarnate Word, whom they cannot see." (Pope Paul VI)

Liturgical Tidbit

The Gestures at Mass

Something that distinguishes our Catholic worship with other Christian services is that within the mass we have quite a bit of different gestures we do, namely; sitting, standing, kneeling, bowing, genuflecting, striking the breast, etc. You may have wondered why we do all of these things in mass and why not simply sit down for the whole mass. The answer is quite simple, really. We make gestures in mass, because *they convey basic human emotions communicated through actions*. When the president of a country enters a conference room, most people in that room will probably stand in order to greet him/her. In the ancient world, if the king and queen is in someone's presence, then that person would usually greet them with one knee on the ground or by bowing. If a person is sorry for something they've done, one of the ways they can express their sorrow for their offense is to strike their chest. We do all of these basic gestures in mass too! Remember now, whenever we're in mass, we are in the presence of Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe. We stand in the beginning to honor his entrance in our worship, we strike our breast during the *confiteor* to express sorrow from our offenses against him, like Jesus' disciples we sit down as we listen to his words and stories, and we kneel down as he presents himself to us as our king and savior. We don't make different gestures in mass just because we're told to do it, rather because there's usually a symbolic meaning attached to them.

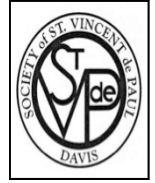
Yearly Donation Statements

The Vincentian Corner

March 3, 2019-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time:

In the Gospel today, Jesus tells us, "A good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces goodness."



We are called to be kind to others and to help the poor. At each SVdeP meeting, Vincentians pray together that God will, "make us responsive to the Christian calling to seek and find the forgotten, the suffering, or the deprived so that we may bring them Your love." In the words of the Most Reverend Blase Cupich, Cardinal Archbishop of Chicago, "The nation's children, families, poor, workers, and senior citizens deserve more than lip service. They deserve more than outrage. They deserve real support, protection, and solid action." Jesus didn't say it would be nice to help the needy; he insisted that care for those in need is central to our lives as Christians. If we as a parish, a community, a nation, turn our backs on those on the fringes of society, whether they be homeless men and women, the invisible poor struggling to make ends meet, or the immigrant hoping to reach safe haven, we are also turning our backs on Jesus as he appears to us in the guise of the needy.

Flu Season and the Suspension of the Cup and other precautions

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has reported that the incidence of flu and flu-like illnesses is widespread and has reached a level requiring that we enact preventive measures to mitigate the possibility of infection at Mass. In order to protect the health and well being of everyone, Bishop Soto has issued the following directives:

- The use of the Communion cup is suspended temporarily.
- Receive the Body of Christ in the hand (although receiving on the tongue is permitted).
- Do not shake hands. Offer the sign of Peace to those around you with a simple nod, say "peace be with you."
- Do not hold hands during the Our Father.
- Extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are reminded to cleanse their hands with an alcohol-based antiseptic before and after administering Holy Communion.

The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and other Holy Days does not apply to those who are sick. If you are sick, stay home and take care of yourself. And pray for those who are sick. The administration of Holy Communion in both species will resume as soon as the Bishop deems it safe and prudent to do so.

Precauciones para evitar el contagio.

El Departamento de Salud Publica de California ha reportado que la incidencia del Flu y enfermedades similares ha llegado a un extremo en que se deben aplicar medidas para evitar contagios durante la Misa.

- No darse la mano. Ofrecer el signo de paz con una inclinación de la cabeza diciendo "la paz este contigo."
- No tomarse de la mano durante el Padrenuestro.
- Los ministros de la Eucaristía deben limpiarse las manos con un antiséptico a base de alcohol antes y después de administrar la Sagrada Comunión a los que visitan en sus casas.

La asistencia a Misa los domingos y días festivos no es obligatoria para los enfermos. Si estás enfermo, quédate en casa y cuídate.

Gracia por su paciencia y comprensión durante esta temporada. Rueda por los enfermos. La Sagrada Comunión por los dos medios retornará cuando el Señor Obispo lo juzgue prudente.

Reglamentos Cuaresmales del 2019

El 6 de marzo de 2019, Miércoles de Ceniza, emprendemos otra vez el recorrido cuaresmal durante el cual procuramos profundizar nuestra conversión. La cuaresma nos prepara para celebrar el Misterio Pascual de la pasión, muerte y resurrección de Cristo. Es tiempo de reflexión y renovación espiritual, tiempo de examinar nuestra relación con Dios y con los demás. También es un momento en el cual los catecúmenos se preparan para recibir el Sacramento de Iniciación en la Vigilia Pascual. La Iglesia también llama a los católicos a adoptar un espíritu de penitencia, especialmente la práctica de los "Actos Religiosos": el ayuno, la oración y la limosna.

AYUNO Y ABSTINENCIA

Abstinencia: Todas las personas que hayan cumplido los 14 años de edad tienen la obligación de **abstenerse de comer carne el miércoles de Ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma**. Otras formas de abstinencia durante la Cuaresma serían: abstenerse de bebidas alcohólicas, televisión, videojuegos, internet, redes sociales y otros dispositivos electrónicos. La Cuaresma es espiritualmente beneficiosa.

Ayuno: Todas las personas, de 18 años hasta los 59, tienen la obligación de **ayunar el miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo**. El ayuno es opcional en otros días de la cuaresma, especialmente los miércoles y viernes, es sumamente recomendable. En casos en que peligre la salud o la capacidad de trabajo, no se aplican las leyes del ayuno y abstinencia. Si se tienen dudas al respecto, se ha de consultar con un sacerdote de la parroquia o con un confesor.

ORACIÓN

Con el fin de profundizar nuestro amor por Cristo, los católicos debemos orar y meditar las Sagradas Escrituras; participar en los actos piadosos que ofrezca nuestra parroquia; y orar con mayor fervor individualmente, en familia y en comunión con otras personas. A los fieles se les exhorta a que recen el rosario, visiten al Santísimo Sacramento y oren, especialmente por las vocaciones al sacerdocio y a la vida consagrada, y por la paz mundial.

LIMOSNA

Todos los católicos se les pide que ayuden generosamente a las obras caritativas de la Iglesia, incluyendo las contribuciones regulares a su parroquia y a la Campaña Católica Anual. Se les invita también a que ayuden de diferentes maneras a los enfermos, a los necesitados, a los ancianos y encarcelados. El ayuno y la abstinencia junto con las obras de caridad ayudan al católico a vivir en solidaridad con Cristo crucificado reflejado en la imagen de sus hermanos y hermanas que sufren.
