You **must** pre-register for Weekend Masses and the limit is 80 people per Mass. There is a Sign Up Genius link on our website (<https://www.signupgenius.com/go/10c0e44aeae2ca2f58-stjames>). Just click on the link and follow the directions to sign up. Or call the office at (530-756-3636) M-F, 8 am to 3pm and sign up on the phone. The deadline to sign up for the Masses is the Friday before the Mass at 12pm.

We are working hard to make sure everything is clean and safe for everyone.

The following are the procedures that need to be followed to make sure we are in compliance with the county and state.

- If you are sick, please stay home.
- Come 10-15 minutes early.
- You will need time to check in, have your temperature taken, use hand sanitizer, and be ushered to your seat.
- Use the bathroom at home before Mass. Bathrooms will be unavailable.
- If you need water during Mass, please bring your own.
- You may bring your own hand sanitizer and wipes, if you prefer.
- Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth at all times. No gloves, please.
- Keep social distance of 6 feet at all times.

A special message from our Pastor, Fr. Rey:

Pope Francis recently reminded us we will survive this coronavirus situation by sticking together. He invites us to live this moment with humility, penance, compassion and hope, and to demonstrate our solidarity with others; especially those who suffer.

Yes, these are dark times for many of us. Yet our faith commends us to not be consumed by fear, insecurity, and anxiety. As followers of Jesus, we put our trust in God who, in the power of the Holy Spirit, sends us to be about God's mission of restoration, reconciliation and wholeness in the face of brokenness, alienation, and illness.

Now is the time for us to be the Church that God wants us and needs us to be. Rather than live in fear, let us together approach this challenge in faith. We have an opportunity to model each other what a faith-filled and faithful response can be. We must remain rational, reasoned and to approach this pandemic in a spirit of trust. It may well impact our families and the lives of those we love. Be careful. Be cautious. Be wise and practical in what you do. But do not live in fear.

What I do fear, more than COVID-19, is that we will forget who we are and to whom we belong. Yes, we need to rely on health professionals for advice and best practices. Yet, we need to entrust our lives to Christ. Have confidence our Faith gives us the strength to overcome the challenges confronting us today. And then we need to step back - stay centered and remind each other we belong to Christ.

The pandemic has changed so much of our daily lives for the time-being. But it has not changed our need to carry on as the St. James community, supporting our Catholic faith and ministries. Here at St. James our vibrant ministries, faith formation and Catholic education have been severely disrupted by the pandemic. Limitations on weekend Mass participation have impacted our sense of community with a concurrent reduction of 25% in parish income.

Understandably, this has placed a tremendous strain on our ability to operate and maintain our parish facilities. So, my friends today I humbly ask for your generous financial support. For those having reduced or suspended contributions to our parish please resume your ongoing support. For those having not been impacted by COVID-19 and are in a position to do so, I ask your consideration of increasing your support. And, for those presently unable to contribute, please pray for all of us and a future of vibrant liturgy, ministry and service to our Community of Faith. I encourage you to peruse this website and review the various ways you can help support our Community of Faith.

The Vincentian Corner

October 25 —Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel Jesus responds to a group of Pharisees attempting to trip him up regarding the greatest of the commandments by telling them, “You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments.”

The love of God is central to our lives: love with all one's heart, soul, and mind. If the second commandment to love neighbor as self is like the first, then we might surmise that we must love our neighbor in the same way as we love God. In Jesus words, we find the truth that loving God isn't merely a matter of fervor in our hearts, but that it must be expressed in doing good for the sake of others. In this time of turmoil in our world and our nation, it is our needy neighbors who suffer most seriously, whether it be from civil unrest, illness and economic instability resulting from the COVID -19 pandemic, or global climate change-related wildfires, storms and other phenomena. The book of Proverbs tells us, “Those who shut their ears to the cry of the poor will themselves call out and not be answered.” Pray that we are all inspired to reach out to those of our neighbors most in need.

SAINTS SIMON AND JUDE, APOSTLES October 28

Saint Jude, apostle and . . . Hollywood success story? Indeed! Beyond Simon's being a “Zealot” for Israel's liberation and Jude's question about Jesus revealing himself (John 14:22), no historic facts are known about either saint. But Saint Jude's well-known patronage of lost causes and hopeless cases is largely due to a desperate vow made just before World War II by a struggling entertainer, the son of Arab-American immigrants, Danny Thomas. Unemployed, his wife about to give birth, Danny, attending Mass, impulsively donated his last seven dollars to the collection, promising: “Saint Jude, if you help me find my way in life, I will build a shrine in your honor!” Older Americans remember well Danny's long, successful movie and television career. Grateful parents worldwide know the miracles that have taken place for fifty years at his Saint Jude Children's Research Hospital, where needy children are cared for regardless of race, religion, or financial resources, and monumental advances continue in healing and preventing pediatric cancers and catastrophic childhood diseases. A living, life-giving partnership is this “Communion of Saints”: Simon, Jude, Danny Thomas—us!

SANTOS SIMÓN Y JUDAS (Siglo I)

28 de octubre

Simón fue uno de los Doce y para distinguirlo de Simón Pedro, le llamaban el “zelote”, porque pertenecía a un grupo de judíos que esperaban la venida del Mesías como una liberación de Roma y sus impuestos. Además de los Doce nombres, Judas es mencionado en el Evangelio de san Juan al preguntarle a Jesús la razón por la cual sólo se manifiesta a ellos y no al mundo entero. Judas Tadeo, para distinguirlo del Iscariote, también fue de los Doce Apóstoles. Se cree que Judas se fue a predicar a Mesopotamia (actual Iraq), mientras que Simón se fue a predicar a Egipto. De alguna manera se unieron para evangelizar Persia (actual Irán) y ahí fueron martirizados. A Judas se le considera el autor de la carta de Judas que aparece en el Nuevo Testamento. En sólo 25 versos, el apóstol distingue a los líderes de los falsos maestros. Aunque ocupa el último lugar en la lista de los Doce, Judas Tadeo es el santo patrono de las causas difíciles y desesperadas. Goza de un gran afecto entre los cristianos.

“¡Devuélvelo ahora mismo!” ¿Cuántas veces hemos escuchado esa frase, probablemente más de una vez, cuando éramos niños?
