A special message from our Pastor, Fr. Rey:

During this period of the COVID-19 pandemic I request prayers for all who are suffering and that the financial needs of our parish and parishioners are met.

Pope Francis recently reminded us we will survive this coronavirus situation by sticking together. He invites us to live this moment with humility, penance, compassion and hope, and to demonstrate our solidarity with others; especially those who suffer.

Yes, these are dark times for many of us. Yet our faith commends us to not be consumed by fear, insecurity, and anxiety. As followers of Jesus, we put our trust in God who, in the power of the Holy Spirit, sends us to be about God's mission of restoration, reconciliation and wholeness in the face of brokenness, alienation, and illness.

Now is the time for us to be the Church that God wants us and needs us to be.

Rather than live in fear, let us together approach this challenge in faith. We have an opportunity to model each other what a faith-filled and faithful response can be. We must remain rational, reasoned and to approach this pandemic in a spirit of trust. It may well impact our families and the lives of those we love. Be careful. Be cautious. Be wise and practical in what you do. But do not live in fear.

What I do fear, more than COVID-19, is that we will forget who we are and to whom we belong.

Yes, we need to rely on health professionals for advice and best practices. Yet, we need to entrust our lives to Christ. Have confidence our Faith gives us the strength to overcome the challenges confronting us today. And then we need to step back - stay centered and remind each other we belong to Christ.

The pandemic has changed so much of our daily lives for the time-being. But it has not changed our need to carry on as the St. James community, supporting our Catholic faith and ministries.

Here at St. James our vibrant ministries, faith formation and Catholic education have been severely disrupted by the pandemic. Limitations on weekend Mass participation have impacted our sense of community with a concurrent reduction of 25% in parish income.

Understandably, this has placed a tremendous strain on our ability to operate and maintain our parish facilities.

So, my friends today I humbly ask for your generous financial support. For those having reduced or suspended contributions to our parish please resume your ongoing support. For those having not been impacted by COVID-19 and are in a position to do so, I ask your consideration of increasing your support. And, for those presently unable to contribute, please pray for all of us and a future of vibrant liturgy, ministry and service to our Community of Faith. I encourage you to peruse this website and review the various ways you can help support our Community of Faith.

Dear St. James Parishioners,

We will be celebrating two(2) Outside Masses on Sundays, English at 8am and Spanish at 9:30am every weekend. The Masses will be celebrated on the patio between the Memorial Center and the School (behind the mural of St. Francis).

We are working hard to make sure everything is clean and safe for everyone. The following are the Procedures that need to be followed to make sure we are in compliance with the county and state.

Register for Mass

You **must** pre-register for Mass and the limit is 40 people per Mass. There is a Sign Up Genius link on our website (<https://www.signupgenius.com/go/10c0e44aeae2ca2f58-stjames>). Just click on the link and follow the directions to sign up. Or call the office at (530-756-3636) M-F, 8 am to 3pm and sign up on the phone.

The deadline to sign up for the outside Masses is the Friday before the Mass at 2pm.

Rules and Procedures

We also ask you to follow these rules to keep everyone healthy:

- If you are sick, please stay home.
- Come 10-15 minutes early.
- You will need time to check in, have your temperature taken, use hand sanitizer, and be ushered to your seat.
- Use the bathroom at home before Mass. Bathrooms will be unavailable.
- If you need water during Mass, please bring your own.
- You may bring your own hand sanitizer and wipes, if you prefer.
- Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth at all times. No gloves, please.
- Keep social distance of 6 feet at all times.

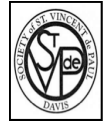

The Gospel today announces that the kingdom and salvation are for all people. It is our persistent calling out to Jesus and our faith that count, for Jesus always responds.

RANDOM THOUGHTS AND PRAYERS CONTINUED

--I think that it is during those times in our lives when we are challenged the most that God does His greatest work in us. His perfect love casts out our fear and helps us to be at peace with ourselves. We are called to be loving and compassionate like Jesus and to savor those times when He has showed us His love and mercy. When we walk with God in our lives we do not face any situation alone, the greatest love story in our lives, the greatest conversation in our lives, is that between God and each of us. We are each God's masterpiece. When the priest lifts up the paten during the Offertory at Mass, we should offer everything -including ourselves- to God.

--We can each be a difference-maker in our lives. Do we sow seeds of kindness? Do we model a life of blessing and integrity for our family and for other? Others will see the goodness of God by the way we live. When we do the right thing, the right way, for the right reason – especially when no one is watching – we do the work of God. “God give me the strength to do what is right.”

--Our faith pleases God and we should pray with great faith - bold-sized prayers - without ceasing. God who created the universe, the stars, the seas, the mountains, us, etc, can do anything. Praying for ordinary things is good and so is praying for big things. We might not get what we ask for – but, we might. God wants us to pray; He wants us to ask for the goals, the dreams and the petitions in our hearts. He wants us to have faith. He wants us to pray for one another.

--Jesus always invites us to go to Him. Our going to Jesus is an immersion in His love, “Here I am Lord, I come to do your will. I love you Lord, help me to love you more, I thank you Lord for all your blessings, Bless me in life and death that I may praise you forever in heaven.”

--When our goals and ideas become so strong, so all-consuming, so much the focus of our life, they can become idols. We can put our dreams on the altar of God and, even if they don't work out, we should continue to love God, release control to Him and trust in Him. We don't have to release our dreams but we can release all the frustration and worry we attach to getting our dreams. We cannot make God do what we want Him to do but we can control our attitude. Life is too short to live frustrated by things that we can't control. Every day is a great gift from God – we need to use it well.

--God chose us to be His before we were born – we are each a child of God, redeemed and wrapped in His graces. He wants us to be people of service-our service is a great gift because we are serving God. We owe God everything. God calls us to serve Him – to be all we can be. “Dear God, we praise your holy Name. Amen.”

--“Taste and see the goodness of the Lord.” God is always at work in our lives. What has God done for you? Remembering His work in our lives increases our faith – and our gratitude.

--God wants each of us to be a person of honor – a carrier of honor in our lives. If we have a culture of honor in our lives we will respect and celebrate others with our words and actions. Be kind; dump sarcasm, insults and gossip. We don't change a dishonorable situation by pouring more dishonor on it. Showing honor is a real test of our character – it is a response to the action of God's grace in our hearts and souls. Honor someone – today.

--Do you listen to God or to someone else? I have found it easier listening to loud noises rather than the quiet whisperings of the Holy Spirit. Jesus calls us to really listen and also to walk in the Light because He is the Light. I pray that God will guide all of our steps – but He can't – if we are unwilling to move our feet.

--Jesus humbled Himself to become human. To reach our highest potential as humans we often have to humble ourselves-forgive others, do our best even if we get no recognition, admit our errors put pride down, and, stop making excuses. We don't always have to be right. Little acts of kindness can make a big difference in other people's lives. Take the high road. How amazing it is that when you humble yourself, you actually make yourself the bigger person.

--“We walk in faith.” Faith is very powerful. Our all-powerful God is always with us. Can your faith be seen? God is not limited by the laws of nature or by facts. God is bigger than facts. He is limited, however, by what we choose to believe. God always has us “in the palm of His hand.” “The Lord is our Light and our Salvation.” Fear can take our faith in the wrong direction. It often presents itself as being much bigger than any problem we may have. But – our God is much bigger. It has been said that “when fear knocks, let our faith answer the door.” Jesus asks each of us to be strong and of good courage – may we continually thank God for His divine presence in our lives and for His great goodness.

--Dear God, I pray, I am yours. I come to do your will. St. Augustine said that “saints are sinners who never gave up trying.” God doesn't judge people as people do. God is a God of hearts who looks into our hearts. We need to give ourselves permission to have faults – we are not perfect, but we can grow and improve. We are an ongoing process. God did not make mistakes in how He created each of us. God never stops loving us.

--Pray for each other especially for those who are isolated and alone during this very difficult time and those who have no one to pray for them.

Mantenga su distancia de 6 pies todo el tiempo.

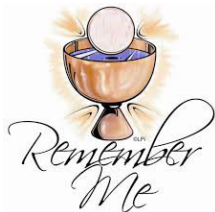
La dispensa del Obispo Soto sigue en pie.

Recordando a Cristo en la Comunión

La fuente y la cumbre de nuestra fé! Así lo dijo el concilio Vaticano II en su primer documento, una declaración claramente prominente. Hoy la Iglesia Universal espera en solidaridad mientras revisita sus tradiciones. A pesar de ser una práctica muy antigua en nuestra Iglesia, hay preguntas sobre la efectividad y legitimidad de la Comunión Espiritual. Una buena mirada a los orígenes de nuestra Fé sería un buen comienzo para entender.

Jesús no escribió nada cuando estableció su Iglesia. El lo dejó a los Apóstoles y sus seguidores para que lo hicieran. Entonces, qué hicieron los liturgistas de los primeros años con respecto a la Eucaristía? Resultó que la recepción de la Eucaristía ofrece un beneficio espiritual solo a los que están propiamente preparados a recibirla. En otras palabras, la recepción espiritual es más importante que la recepción física. Estamos hablando de cosas muy por
