A special message from our Pastor, Fr. Rey:

During this period of the COVID-19 pandemic I request prayers for all who are suffering and that the financial needs of our parish and parishioners are met.

Pope Francis recently reminded us we will survive this coronavirus situation by sticking together. He invites us to live this moment with humility, penance, compassion and hope, and to demonstrate our solidarity with others; especially those who suffer.

Yes, these are dark times for many of us. Yet our faith commends us to not be consumed by fear, insecurity, and anxiety. As followers of Jesus, we put our trust in God who, in the power of the Holy Spirit, sends us to be about God's mission of restoration, reconciliation and wholeness in the face of brokenness, alienation, and illness.

Now is the time for us to be the Church that God wants us and needs us to be.

Rather than live in fear, let us together approach this challenge in faith. We have an opportunity to model each other what a faith-filled and faithful response can be. We must remain rational, reasoned and to approach this pandemic in a spirit of trust. It may well impact our families and the lives of those we love. Be careful. Be cautious. Be wise and practical in what you do. But do not live in fear.

What I do fear, more than COVID-19, is that we will forget who we are and to whom we belong.

Yes, we need to rely on health professionals for advice and best practices. Yet, we need to entrust our lives to Christ. Have confidence our Faith gives us the strength to overcome the challenges confronting us today. And then we need to step back - stay centered and remind each other we belong to Christ.

The pandemic has changed so much of our daily lives for the time-being. But it has not changed our need to carry on as the St. James community, supporting our Catholic faith and ministries.

Here at St. James our vibrant ministries, faith formation and Catholic education have been severely disrupted by the pandemic. Limitations on weekend Mass participation have impacted our sense of community with a concurrent reduction of 25% in parish income.

Understandably, this has placed a tremendous strain on our ability to operate and maintain our parish facilities.

So, my friends today I humbly ask for your generous financial support. For those having reduced or suspended contributions to our parish please resume your ongoing support. For those having not been impacted by COVID-19 and are in a position to do so, I ask your consideration of increasing your support. And, for those presently unable to contribute, please pray for all of us and a future of vibrant liturgy, ministry and service to our Community of Faith. I encourage you to peruse this website and review the various ways you can help support our Community of Faith.

Dear St. James Parishioners,

We will be celebrating two(2) Outside Masses on Sundays, English at 8am and Spanish at 9am every weekend. The Masses will be celebrated on the patio between the Memorial Center and the School (behind the mural of St. Francis).

We are working hard to make sure everything is clean and safe for everyone. The following are the Procedures that need to be followed to make sure we are in compliance with the county and state.

Register for Mass

You **must** pre-register for Mass and the limit is 40 people per Mass. There is a Sign Up Genius link on our website (<https://www.signupgenius.com/go/10c0e44aeae2ca2f58-stjames>). Just click on the link and follow the directions to sign up. Or call the office at (530-756-3636) M-F, 8 am to 3pm and sign up on the phone.

The deadline to sign up for the outside Masses is the Friday before the Mass at 2pm.

Rules and Procedures

We also ask you to follow these rules to keep everyone healthy:

- If you are sick, please stay home.
- Come 10-15 minutes early.
- You will need time to check in, have your temperature taken, use hand sanitizer, and be ushered to your seat.
- Use the bathroom at home before Mass. Bathrooms will be unavailable.
- If you need water during Mass, please bring your own.
- You may bring your own hand sanitizer and wipes, if you prefer.
- Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth at all times. No gloves, please.
- Keep social distance of 6 feet at all times.

The Vincentian Corner

September 6 —Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Wednesday, September 9, the Church celebrates the feast of Blessed Frederic Ozanam, founder of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Introduced to the poor by Blessed Rosalie Rendu, a Daughter of Charity working in the slums of Paris, Frederic heard the call of Jesus to love and serve those who are suffering. And in the poor, he found the face of Christ.

Even though Frederic Ozanam held – with great distinction – a professorial chair in the Sorbonne University in Paris, he still found time to climb the stairs of high tenements to visit, talk with, and bring firewood or food to the poor families who barely eked out an existence there. The home visit became the centerpiece of the Vincentian life, even to our current day. Each time one of our Vincentian home visit teams knocks on the door of someone in need, they are greeted by the same face Blessed Frederic saw almost 200 years ago, the face of Jesus. Consider being a part of that experience by becoming a member of the St. James Conference. During the COVID-19 pandemic, St. James Vincentians have made most of their client contacts via phone and their meetings on ZOOM. RANDOM THOUGHTS AND PRAYERS CONTINUED

--In the "Our Father" we pray "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive others." Jesus said there should be no limit to our willingness to forgive. Forgiveness does not come easy, as we all know. Yet, forgiveness builds bridges, makes relationships possible, and deepens our faith in the mercy and love of Jesus. Mercy allows us to be touched by others. Dear God, help me to show mercy today.

--In the Gospels, Jesus condemns hypocrisy and an unforgiving spirit. Hypocrites pretend to be what they are not; they act on one set of rules for themselves and have another set of rules for the people around them. Hypocrisy is not about making an honest mistake – that is humanity. Jesus reminds us of the dangers of hypocrisy. The hypocrite says "if I can benefit from it, I don't care about others." There is a difference between preaching and practice. If I know what's happening and say nothing, if I see hypocrisy and turn a blind eye against it, this is also hypocrisy. In the Gospel, Jesus calls each of us to faith, humility, respect, love and authenticity. We are the solution and not the problem when we serve God. We can be what God created us to be because of His grace, His love, His mercy and His forgiveness.

--Our lives are short. This world is not our home – we are just passing through – everyone is passing through. None of us are foreigners – we are all fellow pilgrims. I have thought from time to time that our brains are big enough but our hearts are too small. I pray that we can expand our hearts and accept God's unconditional love for each of us. Then the beauty of God's grace will shine from our lives onto our brothers and sisters in Christ, all travelers on the road to our heavenly home.

--Believe: God is; God can; God cares. Just as the sun radiates heat, God radiates goodness. Be on the look-out for God's goodness – even in simple things. Let each of our lives be a hymn of praise to God. Talk to God each day – not just on Sunday – like you would talk to a friend. And, listen to Him.

--Mary is not equal to God but we recognize her importance. God became man through Mary and Mary, in turn became a channel for our redemption. On the cross, Jesus made Mary our Mother and our friend. She graced all the roles she had in life with sublime humility – she humbled herself and was exalted! Humility is a hallmark of our faith. Our world desperately needs the love of our Mother Mary – may she guide us with her love and protection.

--We each came through our mother into this world, but, we also each come from Almighty God. We each have in us the divine nature of God who breathed His life into us. God blessed us with life and destined us to be here – now – at this moment in time. What is our purpose in life? What is our ministry today? Are we doing what Jesus calls us to do? He wants us to continue the work of His kingdom. Words and actions give life to our faith. In spite of our shortcomings, God gives us faith to believe in Him and in His call to us to attain eternal life with Him in heaven. A better tomorrow starts today. Take risks, accept failures and commit to causes larger than yourself. Be a generous giver – we always have something to give to someone else be it a smile, a kind word, a piece of our time. We are never empty-handed.

--Of course, it is good to make plans for the future, but, it is also good to be present in this moment. Ask God: "What are you calling me to do right now?" Faith is an important factor in our salvation. We should not let anything distract us from getting God's graces in this moment.

--Words for me to live by:
Believe, Praise God, Be good to others.

--Excuses, excuses, excuses – we all make them. As long as we make excuses we can justify where we are, and, these excuses can keep us stuck, unmoving, and unhappy. We wait on God to do things for us, but, I believe, He waits for us to get started. Perhaps we need to get rid of some of our excuses and "Sing-A-New-Song", in the words of this beautiful hymn. Don't let excuses hold us back from doing God's work and keep us from using the potential lying dormant inside each of us.

--There is a void in us that only God can fill. God wants to be in relationship with us – He wants to talk with us and waits to hear from us. We are all called to praise God by our life – doing His will at home, at work, at school, wherever we may be, every moment of our life. The Christians life is about our availability to be what God wants us to be. Christ asks for everything from us. But, He also gives us everything. God's love never holds anything back. God will never be outdone in His generosity to us. Thank you, Dear God, for your amazing love and goodness.

**Esto dice el Señor:
“A ti, hijo de hombre,
te he constituido centinela para la casa de Israel.
Ezequiel 33, 7**

La primera lectura del Domingo 23º del Tiempo Ordinario (A) evoca la imagen del centinela. El centinela era el vigilante que velaba por la seguridad de la ciudad. Apostado encima de la muralla de la ciudad, el centinela avisaba de cualquier clase de peligro o amenaza que pudiera afectar a sus conciudadanos. Por tanto, el centinela es el que está llamado a advertir a otros del inminente peligro. Y esta es precisamente la función y el rol del profeta dentro de la comunidad.

Dios quería que el pueblo de Israel tuviera todas las oportunidades para permanecer en el camino recto, para apartarse de sus pecados y para evitar la destrucción provocada por los invasores extranjeros. Para ello Dios se asegura de que Israel tenga todo lo que necesita para mantenerse moralmente recto. Por eso es que Dios envía al pueblo de Israel un vigilante; un centinela.

Dios ofrece a su pueblo una voz humana para desafiarlos y corregirlos, de modo que la responsabilidad de su destino sea solo de ellos. En otras palabras, Dios informa a su pueblo, a través del profeta, que toda acción tiene una consecuencia.

Por tanto, Dios nos dice a través de Sus profetas que somos libres de escoger entre el bien y el mal. Si elegimos la senda del bien nuestra recompensa será disfrutar de la presencia de Dios por toda la eternidad. Si, por el contrario, decidimos caminar por la senda del mal, nuestro destino final será la separación eterna de Aquel que es el origen y la fuente de la felicidad.

Y Dios no desea que ninguna de sus creaturas se pierda. Dios desea que todos gocemos por la eternidad de su presencia. Por tanto, constantemente envía a nosotros voces que cumplen la función del centinela. Vigilantes que velan por nuestra seguridad y bienestar. Profetas que nos desafían y nos corrigen.

Dios nos dirige hacia la felicidad eterna a través de las correcciones que recibimos de nuestros padres. Dios nos corrige a través de las predicas denunciadoras y retadoras de los sacerdotes. Dios nos lleva por el camino del bien a través de los consejos de nuestros abuelos.

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas, corregir y ser corregido no es fácil, pero sí es necesario. Porque más vale corregir a tiempo que lamentarse por la eternidad.

Queridos Parroquianos de St. James,

Si necesita tomar agua durante la Misa, traiga la suya.

Puede traer su propio desinfectante si lo prefiere.

Use la máscara que cubre nariz y boca, todo el tiempo. Por favor no use guantes.

Mantenga su distancia de 6 pies todo el tiempo.

La dispensa del Obispo Soto sigue en pie.

Si usted no se siente bien o todavía no está listo para venir a Misa, no tiene que hacerlo. Continuaremos con la Misa electrónica todos los días. Entre a la página de St. James y oprima el botón de “youtube”.
