For the weekend of October 3-4: English Masses at 5:30 pm (Saturday vigil) and 8 am Sunday.
Spanish Mass will be at 9:30 am.

Beginning the weekend of October 10-11: English Masses will be 5:30pm (Saturday vigil) and 8am and 10am Sunday.
Spanish Mass will be at 12pm noon.

Daily Mass schedule: 7am Mass will be open to parishioners beginning Monday October 5.
We will continue Monday-Friday at 7 am, and Saturday at 8 am.

Register for Mass

You **must** pre-register for Mass and the limit is 80 people per Mass. There is a Sign Up Genius link on our website (<https://www.signupgenius.com/go/10c0e44aeac2ca2f58-stjames>). Just click on the link and follow the directions to sign up. Or call the office at (530-756-3636) M-F, 8 am to 3pm and sign up on the phone. The deadline to sign up for the Masses is the Friday before the Mass at 12pm.

We are working hard to make sure everything is clean and safe for everyone.

The following are the procedures that need to be followed to make sure we are in compliance with the county and state.

- If you are sick, please stay home.
- Come 10-15 minutes early.
- You will need time to check in, have your temperature taken, use hand sanitizer, and be ushered to your seat.
- Use the bathroom at home before Mass. Bathrooms will be unavailable.
- If you need water during Mass, please bring your own.
- You may bring your own hand sanitizer and wipes, if you prefer.
- Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth at all times. No gloves, please.
- Keep social distance of 6 feet at all times.

A special message from our Pastor, Fr. Rey:

Pope Francis recently reminded us we will survive this coronavirus situation by sticking together. He invites us to live this moment with humility, penance, compassion and hope, and to demonstrate our solidarity with others; especially those who suffer.

Yes, these are dark times for many of us. Yet our faith commends us to not be consumed by fear, insecurity, and anxiety. As followers of Jesus, we put our trust in God who, in the power of the Holy Spirit, sends us to be about God's mission of restoration, reconciliation and wholeness in the face of brokenness, alienation, and illness.

Now is the time for us to be the Church that God wants us and needs us to be. Rather than live in fear, let us together approach this challenge in faith. We have an opportunity to model each other what a faith-filled and faithful response can be. We must remain rational, reasoned and to approach this pandemic in a spirit of trust. It may well impact our families and the lives of those we love. Be careful. Be cautious. Be wise and practical in what you do. But do not live in fear.

What I do fear, more than COVID-19, is that we will forget who we are and to whom we belong. Yes, we need to rely on health professionals for advice and best practices. Yet, we need to entrust our lives to Christ. Have confidence our Faith gives us the strength to overcome the challenges confronting us today. And then we need to step back - stay centered and remind each other we belong to Christ.

The pandemic has changed so much of our daily lives for the time-being. But it has not changed our need to carry on as the St. James community, supporting our Catholic faith and ministries. Here at St. James our vibrant ministries, faith formation and Catholic education have been severely disrupted by the pandemic. Limitations on weekend Mass participation have impacted our sense of community with a concurrent reduction of 25% in parish income.

Understandably, this has placed a tremendous strain on our ability to operate and maintain our parish facilities. So, my friends today I humbly ask for your generous financial support. For those having reduced or suspended contributions to our parish please resume your ongoing support. For those having not been impacted by COVID-19 and are in a position to do so, I ask your consideration of increasing your support. And, for those presently unable to contribute, please pray for all of us and a future of vibrant liturgy, ministry and service to our Community of Faith. I encourage you to peruse this website and review the various ways you can help support our Community of Faith.

The Vincentian Corner October 4 —Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's second reading, St. Paul writes to the believers in Philippi, "Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayers and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God."

As we continue to experience the seemingly never-ending stream of bad news about COVID-19, civil unrest, economic uncertainty, wildfires, and the toxic political environment, it is helpful to consider Paul's words of advice. In the spirit of St. Vincent de Paul, our Holy Father, Pope Francis tells us, "We cannot follow Jesus on the path of love unless we first love others, unless we force ourselves to work together to understand each other, and to forgive each other, recognizing our own limits and mistakes. We must do works of mercy and with mercy! . . . For the Good Shepherd, what is far, what is on the margins, what is lost and unappreciated, is the object of greater care, and the Church cannot but make her own this special love and attention. The first in the Church are those who are the most in need, humanly, spiritually, materially, the neediest." In this time of trial, let us pray for forgiveness and conciliation between all those currently estranged by social, political, and religious beliefs and those whose lives have been disrupted by the economic fall-out of the pandemic.

This campaign provides support to women in crisis who make the life-affirming choice of carrying their babies to term. We at Spero/Pregnancy Support Group (Spero/PSG) give women education in how their babies are developing in the womb, how to prepare for the birth and how to parent their children as they grow. We also share the Word of God through the Bible and prayer. And we provide periodic ultrasounds, which help to bond moms to the new little lives growing inside their bodies. By attending our classes, moms earn points that they exchange for maternity and baby clothes, diapers, wipes, strollers, etc.

News from the Newman Catholic Center:

The Newman Catholic Center is excited to start another year of outreach and ministry for university students. Once again, we have taken the summer to make some improvements to the Center that include more picnic benches, new shaded areas to study or pray, expanded outdoor lighting, some landscape work, and over 4500 sq ft of turf that makes our whole property green in more ways than one. We are happy to announce the Sunday Student Mass (hosted by the Diocese of Sacramento) will be outdoors, at Newman, on Sundays at 2:30 PM, starting on Oct. 4th. A weekday student Mass will also be at Newman, on Wednesdays, at 5 pm, starting Oct 7. Newman nights, our primary formation gathering, will start back up on Thursday, Oct 8, at 7 PM, at Newman. All Masses and Newman Nights will be streamed live for participation at home as well. All formation gatherings are being hosted by the Diocese of Sacramento. And, all gatherings at the center will comply with strict COVID distancing and sanitization policies. Masks are **REQUIRED!** This will be an exciting and unique year for the Newman Center. Unfortunately, due to last year's building closures, we have no regular large group facility or hall. While weather holds up, all events and activities on our site will be outdoors. We are also seeking support for one important immediate need—a Chapel for the Blessed Sacrament. The closures also made us the only Newman Center in the Diocese without a Chapel. To install a small, secure shed-like structure will cost about \$6000. **Pues bien, la viña del Señor de los ejércitos es la casa de Israel,
y los hombres de Judá son su plantación preferida.
El Señor esperaba de ellos que obraran rectamente
y ellos, en cambio, cometieron iniquidades;
él esperaba justicia y sólo se oyen reclamaciones.
Isaías 5, 7**

Al escuchar las lecturas que la Iglesia nos presenta en el Domingo 27 del Tiempo Ordinario (A) me viene a mi mente el canto del Viñador. Un canto que con frecuencia escuchamos en nuestra celebración Eucarística y que claramente describe lo que la Primera Lectura y el Evangelio nos presentan.

Las lecturas nos presentan un retrato de un Dios de amor, un Dios que persigue a su gente, buscando su pueblo, escuchando sus lamentos, salvándolo de la esclavitud, prometiendo su fidelidad, mandándoles profetas, salvándoles de sus enemigos, perdonando sus delitos y al final sufriendo su rechazo.

En la primera lectura el Profeta Isaías nos muestra el cuidado amoroso de Dios por su pueblo escogido. Para describir este cuidado amoroso el profeta usa la figura de un viñador que cuida de su viña con amor. La imagen de la viña es una figura utilizada con frecuencia por otros profetas del Antiguo Testamento para describir la relación de Dios con su pueblo.

Es notorio el contraste que encontramos en nuestras lecturas. Por una parte, vemos el amor generoso y gratuito de Dios, frente a la indiferencia y desagradecimiento del pueblo escogido. La viña ha recibido los cuidados necesarios para producir buenas uvas. Sin embargo, la viña solo ha producido uvas agrias.

Y esta es una historia que se repite constantemente, en cada uno de nosotros. Dios, nuestro amigo el viñador, nos colma de sus gracias y bendiciones para que produzcamos uvas buenas. Para que nuestras obras y palabras endulcen a los que nos rodean. Sin embargo, pareciera que no siempre mejoramos la vida de los demás. Y es que cada que pecamos producimos solo amargos frutos.

Pero a pesar de ello, nuestro amigo el viñador continúa buscando a su pueblo. Nos sigue perdonando e invitándonos a una intimidad con su presencia divina. Y por ello le damos gracias a Dios por su infinita misericordia.
